MIDDLE SCHOOL SCHEDULING OVERVIEW

Over the months of March and April, 6th, 7th, and 8th grade teachers, counselors, and administrators will be preparing for the middle school scheduling process. There will be specific information sent home with your child, information listed on the web site, discussions at PTA meetings, and an evening orientation meeting for parents of grade six students on April 2, 2007, from 7:00-9:00 P.M. in our auditorium. We thought it would be beneficial to review the most commonly asked questions. Please feel free to call our guidance office for further information.

Q. How do the recommendations take place for subjects such as math/math enrichment, world language/reading?

A. These recommendations are based on criteria, which you will receive with your child's scheduling forms. These criteria have been developed over the years based on student PSSA achievement data, nine weeks grades, teacher recommendation, and daily student performance.

 - Provide input into the development of job descriptions, qualifications, and criteria
 - Establish that applicants for elected positions have qualifications as outlined in the bylaws

2007-2008 PTHS SCHEDULING

Here is some additional information regarding the High School scheduling process. Please keep in mind that the dates and times may change depending on any changes the high school guidance department may enact.

- The high school guidance counselors will have presented the 9th grade course selection process to current 8th grade students on February 21, 2007, during their social studies classes. During this session, the students received their course selection sheet, materials to prepare for the high school transition, and an explanation of the step-by-step process on how they are to complete their course selection sheets.
- The 8th grade students will have approximately one week to have their current 8th grade teachers complete their recommendations on the course selection sheet. The students will be required to have a parent's signature on the sheet before it is turned in to the middle school guidance counselors.

- 2. Find the best, qualified people to lead your PTA.
 - Develop a process to recommend nominees with the following qualities:
 - Vision and leadership: the ability to see the big picture and the courage to set direction to achieve the PTA missions
 - ➤ Stewardship: The integrity to serve the interests and pursue the goals of the organization
 - Knowledge: Knowledge of PTA, its operations, and organization
 - ➤ Diligence: Dedication and commitment to the PTA's goals
 - Collegiality: Possessing a sincere and respectful attitude toward fellow PTA members and their views
 - Communicate with all members of the PTA to identify a diverse but representative group of potential leaders
 - Continue to establish the pool of potential leaders from inside and outside the PTA
 - Create a pipeline for future leaders by being forward-thinking
 - Be well-versed in the responsibilities and skill sets required for all positions
- 3. Screen, evaluate, and select potential leaders.
 - Screen and interview potential leaders prior to putting them on the slate
 - Determine the slate and seek the consent of each candidate
 - Announce the slate of candidates according to the procedures in the bylaws
- Recommend opportunities for training to enhance leadership development for the newly elected officers and board members.
- 5. The work of the nominating committee is not complete until all officers are elected.

If anyone is interested in becoming a member of the nominating committee, please let me know as soon as possible. Your responsibilities will begin upon being selected in March and will end after the election of the officers at the May meeting. All work done as part of the nominating committee can be performed according to your time and schedule. You do not have to be at the school to perform this function. At least one member of the nominating committee must attend the April and May PTA meetings.

Q. Who do I call if I have a question on my child's recommendation?

A. You would call your child's teacher. Please be aware that especially for grade six students, your call needs to go to **Grade 6 teachers** not to the middle school counselors or administrators. Those teachers know and teach your child on a daily basis. For all grade levels, understand that these recommendations have been very accurate over the years and are made with your child's academic success in mind.

Q. When will my sixth grade child get to visit the middle school?

A. Your child will be visiting the middle school in March to watch the middle school musical and in June for a tour and introductory video. We will also have an orientation in August.

Q. My son/daughter wants to be on the same team with his/her friends.

A. One of the growth opportunities provided children beginning with the middle school is the understanding that middle school is the time to meet new friends, change classes, and expand on a social level. We do not schedule friends together based on any requests.

Q. I heard that Teacher "X" is someone who my child would love. Can I have that teacher?

A. We do not promise or provide specific teachers for students. All of our teachers care about students, teach the written required curriculum, and work very hard to meet your child's needs.

Q. I have twins: are there any special scheduling considerations?

A. Yes. Due to the fact that you have two children at the same time in the same grade, you may have family reasons as to keeping them together or keeping them separate. You cannot pick the team they will be on, but we give you the option of having them on the same or different teams. Send this request to Dr. Merante by April 16, 2007. Please be aware that though your children may be on the same team, they may not be in the same classes together. However, they will have lunch and recess together.

Q. Does every child have study lab?

A. No, but every child has the opportunity for one; however, if he/she chooses to have a music elective he/she may not have a daily study lab. If a child enrolls in one music elective- band, orchestra, or chorus he/she will have that course every other day opposite a study lab. If he/she chooses to have both chorus and band or chorus and orchestra, he/she will not have a study lab. Gifted and learning support classes also affect study labs.

Q. When will my child receive his/her schedule, homeroom number, locker, and locker combination?

A. Grade 7 students will receive he/her schedule and all pertinent information during grade 7 orientation in August. Grade 8 students will come to the middle school and pick up their information on a day to be announced in August. Due to construction, we do not have those dates right now. We will advertise them before the end of the school year.

Q. What does my child need for gym class?

A. She/he will need to have red shorts and a solid color white t-shirt. The t-shirts may contain a Peters Township Logo but the logo is not required.


