Beech Elementary School:

After School Clubs and Tutoring began in January! This year we will host 2 different 6 week sessions of clubs. The clubs being offered are being run by our Beech staff and include Art Club, Acting Club, Yearbook Club, Cooking Club, Board Game Club, and SEL Club. After School Tutoring runs 2 days per week and is available for students at each grade level who have been identified by NWEA and classroom data as needing additional support outside of the traditional classroom/intervention block. There are over 80 students participating in clubs and approximately 90 students participating in tutoring!

Student and Parent Engagement Opportunities at Beech: In January, Beech hosted our first Student Panel for grades 3rd-6th. Students had the opportunity to share their voice in a safe and welcoming environment as they answered questions about the culture, learning, safety, and care at Beech. This was the first of what will be a continued series of panel opportunities for students!

Session 3 of Parent University was hosted at Beech in January. Our session focused on Supporting Students Healing and Growth. Parents worked with Principal Nickel, Interim Principal Burch, and Sabrina Rudy from Wayne RESA to talk about resilience, the effects of trauma on the brain, shared resources for trauma informed parenting, and talked about how families could create a network of support. While the parents were meeting with administration and Wayne RESA, the students were working with Beech and Hilbert staff to discuss ways that they could be resilient. The students created network maps for who they could go to for support at home and in the school community! Session 4 is digging deeper into this topic and will incorporate role playing with scenarios that we are seeing most frequently in the school and home setting with our students.

Hilbert Elementary School:

Students of the Month for January: We are excited to start our Students of the Month program. Each month teachers nominate a student from their own class who shows positive characteristics of outstanding citizenship. It was wonderful reading about the nominees and to see them acknowledged and rewarded.

Reading Buddies: Many of our classrooms have paired older students with younger students to read together. Mrs. Chartier's sixth grade class and Mrs. Faulkner's second grade class met last week to begin their partnership.

PBIS Council: Our SEL Specialist, Allison Hubert, started a PBIS council that is comprised of students from K-6 grade classrooms. The council meets once a month to coordinate opportunities to engage students more in school-wide activities. This month, they sponsored a Candygram sale for the school community to send to each other.

Redford Union Junior High School:

There has been a whirlwind of activity as the students and staff at Redford Union Junior High School wrapped up semester one and dove into semester two. Our counseling team has been working extremely hard to make sure that they set up meetings with those students who did not have a successful semester one in the form of letters sent home and parent meetings scheduled. We also celebrated our counselors Mrs. Paulette Rancour and Ms. Christal Malone during the week of February 5th since this was National Counselor Appreciation week. We are also celebrating our most improved students from semester one by taking them to the Education Day field trip, which is a partnership between the Motor City Cruise and the Detroit Pistons. This is an all-expense field trip to remind students that they will be rewarded for making the correct adjustments and choosing success.

We have continued to bring in engaging speakers and opportunities for our students. Every Thursday we have mentoring sessions for a group of our 9th grade students who are struggling to consistently make positive choices. Our 9th grade Ambassadors are also part of this group. The focus is on the negative and positive consequences of decision making. Each session has a key word and last week's word was 'empathy.' Students had discussions and role-played scenarios. We also had a guest speaker come in and speak to all our 7th-9th grade boys last week. This speaker was part of the juvenile release program and spoke to the students about the importance of education and how being successful academically truly changes the trajectory of your life. Our students were completely engaged and asked intelligent follow-up questions.

Redford Union High School:

Redford Union High School students who are members of the Detroit Regional Dollars for Scholars program attended Project Runway 2024 at Eastern Michigan University.

160 Next Level Scholar sophomores braved the snow to gather at EMU for leadership and networking training from Jacqueline M. Baker, a campus tour, a program alumni Q&A panel, and more. What a great day! In addition to visiting Eastern Michigan University, our students also visited The University of Michigan for a full campus and academic programming tour.

On February 7th, Redford Union High School had five student-athletes sign their letter of intent to play athletics at the collegiate level during the winter National Signing Day. DeMathew Dixon (Central State University), Parker Kennedy (Central State University), Mike Myles (Olivet), Jakhari Lewis (Olivet), and Elijah Triplett (Adrian College) all signed their letters of intent to play football.

RUHS students Alexander Vazquez and Cain Hester took time out of their busy school schedules to write to the President of the United States. According to veteran History teacher Mrs. Johnson, this is the first time in her 25-plus years of teaching that any of her students received a response from the President.

On February 8, 2024, four of our Symphonic Band students went to Wayne State University to perform in the WSU Honors Band. Our students worked with college professors, future music educators, and students from 32 Metro Detroit area schools. Over 120 students worked from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM to learn five (5) collegiate/professional level pieces of music and perform them this evening!! Our students did such a phenomenal job representing our school that the Wayne State Music Department plans to collaborate and work with the band program in the near future. We are so proud of our students! They performed so well, and we could not be prouder. Congratulations to Reba Adkins, La'Ryeyah Smiley, Owen Blume, and Reyana Irby!

Veritas Alternative Education:

Keeler Day Treatment Programs: Keeler Center had a total of 7 students to be fully and successfully mainstreamed back to their resident districts: 5 from ADT (high school) and 2 from EDT (K-8). More good news is that we have already received referrals to fill many of those vacant spots.

Friendship Circle-Weinberg Village - On Friday, February 2nd the Redford Union ASD program took a field trip to Friendship Circle's Weinberg Village in West Bloomfield to practice the life skills they have been learning. Students in grades K-12 along with teachers, Educational Assistants, district OTs, the ASD social worker, parents and more enjoyed Weinberg Village's 11 locations that enable students to learn and practice life skills. The village is set up like a small town with a hair salon, pharmacy, pet shop, library, doctor's office, movie theater and more. Each is sponsored by a real store i.e.; the hair salon is sponsored by Fringe Salon in West Bloomfield. Each location in the village is designed to focus on 2 or more skills that students can practice.

Superintendent Witt presented the Wayne County Regional Enhancement Millage Renewal which is November 5, 2024. He shared Wayne RESA would be presenting this same presentation at the Wayne County School Board Association meeting on February 15, 2024. He stated that the intent right now is to go through a process to have that renewal be on the November 5th ballot. This election can only take place in even years. Superintendent Witt did not read the entire presentation, but he did hit the highlights. He said that if they need to have a future discussion about this, they could include it at a workshop and then ultimately at some point coming up, the issue would be brought back to a regular board meeting because the board will be asked to act upon this question. The Regional Enhancement Mileage provides all of our districts in Wayne County with additional operating revenues. For the Enhancement Millage to be placed on a ballot, the Board of Education for school districts representing a majority of the students within a region pursuing one of these enhancement millages must pass identical resolution asking for Wayne RESA to pursue an enhancement millage. The regional enhancement mileage must be proposed county wide and then it passes or fails on a county wide basis. Each school board must decide if they wish to place the millage on the ballot and if enough school districts vote yes. So at least 50% representing more than 50% of the student's county wide, then the initiative is placed on the ballot. If the voters passed the millage the ISD or in our case Wayne RESA, collects and then distributes the money equally to all constituent school districts on a per student basis. Wayne RESA does not receive any funding through this regional enhancement millage. He stated that this is something that the District already have in place.

Local districts first became eligible to receive enhancement millage funding after the millage was first passed in 2016.

Superintendent Witt said that the reason the District was looking at this through Wayne RESA and why they are talking about this issue is because the current millage will expire at the end of the 2027/2028 school year.

The presentation continued.

The Board would be asked later in May or sometime between May 1st and July 16th of this year to consider adopting a resolution.

More discussion on the Wayne County Regional Enhancement Millage Renewal will be had at a future Board Workshop.

Board of Education Communication/Discussion:

President Pridemore shared that Thursday, February 14, 2024, is the Wayne County Association of School Boards Meeting at 5:30 pm at Wayne RESA. Dinner will be provided. The Board should have in your district e-mail an e-mail from Dr. Darlene Pomponio, our Wayne County Association of School Board President. She encouraged the Board to attend.

Trustee Bailey spoke on the Sex Education Advisory Board which was discussed at the last Board meeting. He shared a handout with the Board which was the Revised School Code (Excerpt) Act 451 of 1976 – Section 380-1507. Trustee Bailey read some of the laws from the school code. He shared that he contacted the local clergy within Redford Union. He contacted each of the Churches and gave them a copy of the law and he asked if they would be interested if the offer was presented to them.

Pastor Helga of Grace Lutheran Church said yes. Trustee Bailey will give the updated information to the Superintendent, and he will try to get names of some local physicians.

Trustee Bailey proposed the idea that the information would be appropriate for an all-female class and information for an all-male class. He does not think that in a Coed class certain information presented would be taken seriously.

President Pridemore mentioned that the District has an advisory committee in place, including a health professional, because we have a school nurse.

Superintendent Witt shared that he has had discussions internally with Mr. Norton and Mrs. Crenshaw and that they will continue to follow up on this and to make sure that the composition of the committee is what it needs to be. And in addition to that they have talked about the fact that ultimately if they do have clergy that is interested but turns out that person cannot make the meeting. They would make sure at a minimum to create opportunities for them to either review the information and potentially ask questions or even to participate virtually.

Superintendent Witt stated that they will make sure that they follow the process that is outlined by Wayne RESA and the State.

Trustee Martin will pass along some information as it relates to social education for people with special needs with special education to the Superintendent.
