
February 22nd -- 6:00pm - 7:00pm

Garden Flag Sale 5th Grade Legacy Fundraiser




Fairview Elementary is partnering with Polka Dot Owl in Locust to have a Spring Garden Flag sale which will benefit the 5th grade legacy.




Treasure Card Fundraising

This year, Fairview's yearbooks will be ordered online and through Strawbridge - the same company that does our school pictures.




Junior Masters Art Club

Why did you become a teacher? It has always felt like that was what I was supposed to be.


City you want to visit the most: London, England - Actually to go back there, I visited in 1989




How Can You Help Fairview?


