Students Celebrate "I Love to Read Month"

Our month of activities will begin with a kick-off event on Friday, February 2 at WestWood's all school meeting. WestWood students will receive a challenge to work together to collectively read 275,000 minutes at home during the month of February. We would appreciate your assistance in this effort by encouraging your child to read and reading to your child at home throughout the month. Please see the reading logs your child is bringing home to help your child keep track of his/her reading minutes. Students in each grade level have a "target number" of minutes that they are encouraged to read each week.

The minutes are as follows:

Kindergarten: 50 minutes per week
1st Grade: 75 minutes per week
2nd Grade: 100 minutes per week
3rd Grade: 125 minutes per week
4th & 5th Grades: 150 minutes per week

SAGE Academy Ranks High in National Vocabulary Competition

Competing in the difficult Blue Division of the **WordMasters ChallengeTM**, fourth grader Joshua Johnson earned a perfect score of 20 on the challenge. Nationally, only 86 fourth graders achieved this result. Other students from WestWood Elementary/SAGE Academy who achieved outstanding results in the meet include fourth graders Kaia Wozney and Olivia Zirbel, and fifth grader Alexa Bianchi-Rossi.

The WordMasters ChallengeTM is an exercise in critical thinking that first encourages students to become familiar with a set of interesting new words (considerably harder than grade level), and then challenges them to use those words to complete analogies expressing various kinds of logical relationships. Working to solve the analogies helps students learn to think both analytically and metaphorically. Although most vocabulary enrichment and analogy-solving programs are designed for use by high school students, WordMasters ChallengeTM materials have been specifically created for younger students in grades three through eight. They are particularly well-suited for children who are motivated by the challenge of learning new words and enjoy the logical puzzles posed by analogies.

Early Entrance into Kindergarten

Prior Lake-Savage Area Schools has a policy for early entrance into kindergarten for those students who turn five years of age between September 1 and October 15. In order for a student to be considered for early entrance into kindergarten, parents must inform the elementary principal on or before June 1. If you are considering early entrance for your child, please be mindful of the cut-off date. Parents are required to pay for the cost of the testing for early entrance which is approximately \$300.

Student Placement Forms Due May 1

Student Placement forms are now available in the office for parents wishing to give further input into the classroom placement of their child(ren) for the 2018-19 school year. Please fill the form out completely and return to the school office by May 1. Most parents leave classroom placement decisions up to the judgment of their child's teachers and principal who know them best in the school setting. Under certain circumstances, it may be advantageous to offer input. When giving this input, it is important to refer to particular teacher characteristics (i.e. firm, gentle), specific educational interest areas (hands on learner, loves theater), or other special concerns, but not specific teacher names.



Some heart attacks are sudden and intense where there is nodoubts what's happening. But most heart attacks start slowly, with mild pain or discomfort. Often people affected aren't sure what's wrong and wait too long before getting help. Here are signs that can mean a heart attack is happening:

Chest discomfort: Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain.

Discomfort in other areas of the upper body: Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.

Shortness of breath: with or without chest discomfort.

Other signs: may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness.

Warning signs for women may differ from men:

"Although men and women can experience chest pressure that feels like an elephant sitting across the chest, women can experience a heart attack without chest pressure," said Nieca Goldberg, M.D., medical director for the Joan H. Tisch Center for Women's Health at NYU's Langone Medical Center and an American Heart Association volunteer. Instead they may experience the symptoms below.

- -shortness of breath
- -pressure or pain in the lower chest or upper abdomen
- -dizziness, lightheadedness or fainting
- -upper back pressure or extreme fatigue."

Tracy Nelson Mauerer is coming to WW




Award-winning author, **Tracy Nelson Mauerer** will be visiting WestWood Elementary for Grade Level Presentations on March 7, 2018.
