

# NORTH COUNTRY ROAD MIDDLE SCHOOL

Dear Parents and/or Guardians:

As you are reading this newsletter we are half-way through the 2019-2020 school year! The last five months have been filled with many events and achievements that continue to shape our young students. We should all be excited about the prospects for the New Year.

The **scheduling** process for the 2020 - 2021 school year is already underway. In cooperation with the 9<sup>th</sup> grade parent orientation (held at the Miller Place High School), our current 8<sup>th</sup> grade students participated in a **high school scheduling orientation** on Wednesday, January 29<sup>th</sup>, with MPHS and NCRMS guidance counselors. The counselors provided information in reference to the scheduling process for next year and the strategy for their high school experience. Please contact the Miller Place High School Guidance office with specific questions about the MPHS schedule. Our **sixth grade students** will meet with members of our **LOTE** teachers (Languages Other Than English) to discuss the different languages that are studied in grades seven and eight. Students will be able to choose Spanish, Italian, or French as a course of study. We are also “rolling over” the **music course selection** that your child is currently enrolled in. It is important to note that our general music program ends after grade seven. Those that are not enrolled in performance based music will have a study hall in grade eight. If you have any questions about your child’s music course for the 2020 - 2021 school year, please call our guidance department at the middle school.

As we enter the second semester of the academic year, we are headed into the “homestretch” in reference to the preparation for the state assessments. Students in grades 6, 7, and 8 will take the **New York State assessment in English/Language Arts**, and all students in grades 6 & 7 will take the **assessment in Mathematics**. As in the past, only those that are enrolled in Math 8 will challenge the New York State assessment, while those enrolled in Algebra I will challenge the Regents exams. In the area of Science, 8<sup>th</sup> grade students will take the NYS Science Assessment or the NYS Regents in Earth Science. These assessments are one variable that is used to determine the levels of achievement and those students who will need **Academic Intervention Services** (other variables include final grades, final exam grades and teacher recommendation) as mandated by the New York State Education Department.

Congratulations to all that participated in our **2020 National Geographic Geography Bee!!!** Students participated in the Geography Bee on January 23<sup>rd</sup>, a contest that includes questions about our state, our nation, and as we move deeper into the questions, the inquiries include a more global perspective. The questions address geography, geology, and of course the political and economic systems that exist around the world. Our champion this year is **Marc Lindemann (grade 6)**, with our runner up **Michael Drago (grade 7)** not far behind, and **Cameron Golding (grade 7)** placed third. A special thank you to **Mrs. Jacquie Sanatore** for her leadership in reference to this endeavor.

In 2018, our grade seven wheel was amended to include a course called **Project Based Learning**, an opportunity for students to select an interest that they research for a majority of the quarter. After gathering the appropriate background knowledge, students prepare a presentation method of their choosing to share their interest with classmates. **Julianna Skoblicki** (grade 7) prepared a Powerpoint presentation in reference to protecting the diamondback terrapins on Long Island in partnership with **Friends of Flax pond**. Beyond the information, she also fabricated bracelets to dedicate funds for the endeavor, and has raised over \$400 to support the cause! Three students placed in the competition as per the MMA rules in reference to student results. **Jacqueline Reduto (grade 8)** received a bronze medal for their third place score. **Alan Yue (grade 8)** received a silver medal for receiving the second highest score in the middle school. The top score was earned by **Lucy Chang (grade 7)**, who received the gold medal for her top score at North Country Road.
