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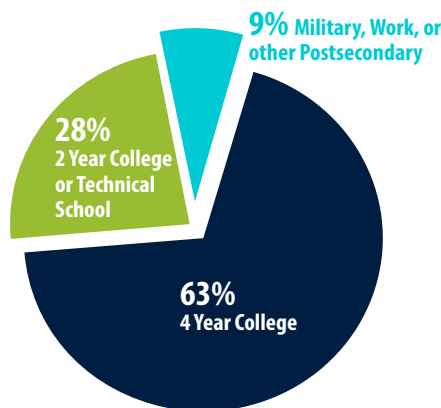
Our Community

The Farmington School District serves the cities of Farmington, Farmington Hills, and a portion of West Bloomfield.

School Features

STRIKE Student Diversity Club - students meet regularly to discuss programming and strategies to promote diversity, equity, and inclusion in our school community. Involved students also have the opportunity to participate in district, regional, and even national activities and training designed to promote equity and inclusion in our community.

Peer Mentorship/LINK Crew - LINK Crew is a high school transition program that increases freshmen success. Members of the junior and senior class are trained by teachers to be LINK Leaders who act as positive role models, motivators, and mentors that help guide freshmen to be successful during the transition to high school.

PTSA Student Leaders - The Student Leaders represent the student voice in the PTSA and promote scholarship, leadership, character, and service for all students. They encourage every student to take the Falcon Challenge which includes: get involved in at least one FHS club or activity, and volunteer 40 hours of community service to earn an honor cord.

Jr. Optimists - The Junior Optimists is a service club that provides support to students as they take on leadership roles in organizing events to better the community and spread optimism. Students have a chance to bring their ideas to life and open themselves up to nationwide leadership positions, inner club competitions, and scholarship opportunities.

Girls Who Code - an international nonprofit organization that aims to support and increase the number of women in computer science. "Girls who Code" hosts a summer Immersion Program, a specialized campus program, after-school clubs, a college club, College Loops, and a series of books.

Career and Technical Education (CTE)

Farmington Public Schools has one of the largest CTE programs in Oakland County with a total of 11 programs in high skill, high wage, and high demand careers in Architecture & Design, Automotive Technology, Business Management, Computer Science, Cybersecurity, Engineering, Finance, Health Science/Medical Skills, Marketing, TV-10 Broadcasting/Film Production, and Web Design. Our Health Science/Medical Skills program offers a year-long EMT course option with licensure eligibility and the Medical Skills Field Study course offers a CPCT (Certified Patient Care Technician) certification option through National Healthcareer Association (NHA).

Sampling of Awards & Achievements

- **HOSA - Future Health Professionals** - 75 members. 72 competed at the Region 8 Leadership Conference hosted at Farmington High School with 26 competitors placing in the top 3 of 45 overall top 8 finalists eligible to advance to State level competition. Three students were ILC qualifiers. One student was elected as a MI HOSA State Officer.
- **DECA** - 64 members and regional competitors, 48 state qualifiers, 16 international qualifiers, 2 students earning top 10 medals at International Competition, 2 students earned 5th place internationally.
- **BPA** - 56 registered members, with many students advanced at regionals and qualified to compete in state and national competitions.
- **Cyberpatriot - NEW CTSSO** - 10 members; won silver at the State competition.
- **CTE Cybersecurity** - 6 students accepted into U of M College of Engineering and Computer Science.
- **Western Michigan University Sales Challenge** - 65 Marketing students participated, 12 students made it to the finals with 1 student taking first place in the Personal Pitch category.
- **Health Science/Medical Skills Credentials** - 10 students eligible for Medical Terminology articulated credit through Oakland Community College, 2 students passed the CPCT (Certified Patient Care Technician) exam for certification.
