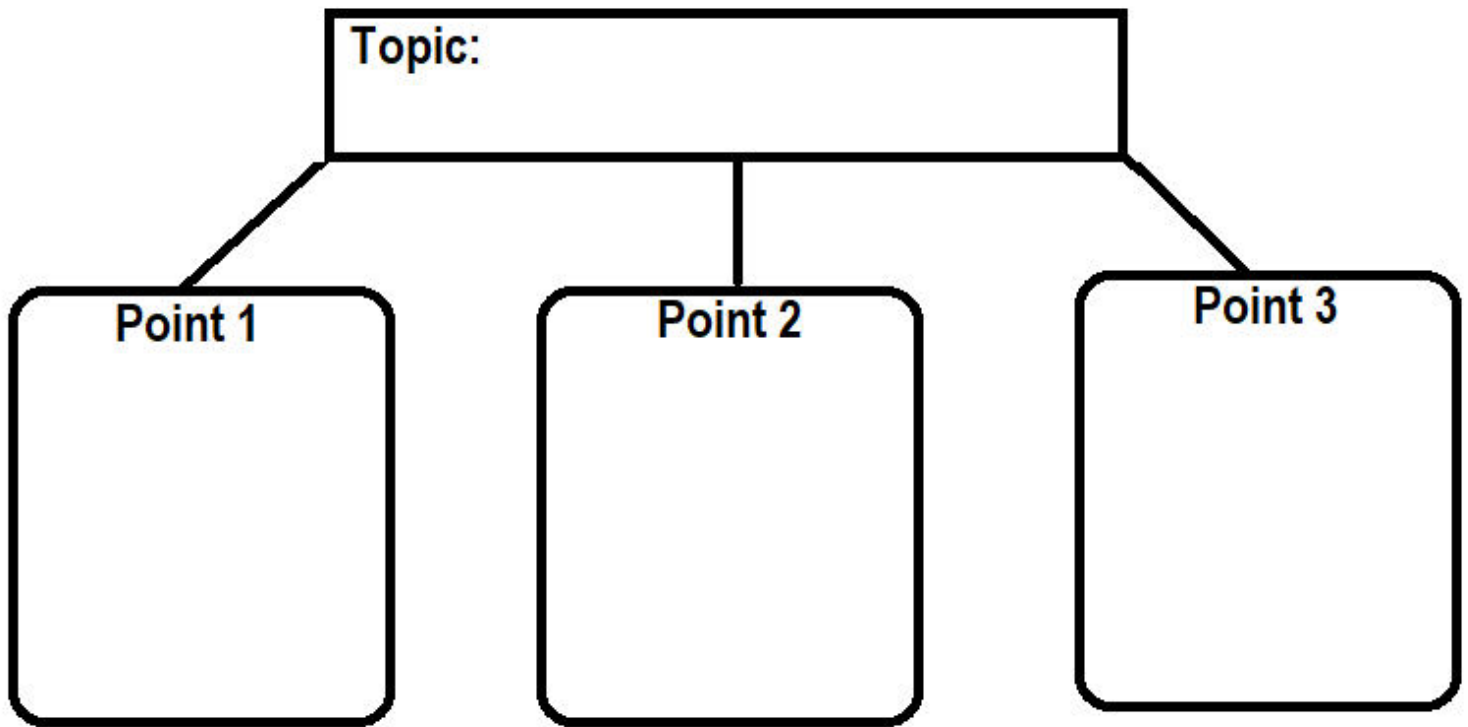


# Five Paragraph Essay Format

INTRODUCTION	
<b>HOOK</b> This is where you grab your reader's attention. Types of Hooks: Question, Quote, Definition, Story, Startling Information	
<b>Background</b> Info on topic, characters, or conflict. If you are writing about literature, include the author and title.	
<b>Thesis</b> What is your claim/opinion? One sentence with three points. (**These points become the topics of your body paragraphs)	

## BODY PARAGRAPH 1

### TOPIC SENTENCE

Expresses the main idea of your paragraph.

### EXAMPLE 1

Sentence that gives facts that support the topic sentence.

<div>SUMMARY</div> <div>Summarize the main points of your essay.</div>	
<div>FINISHED FEELING</div> <div>This sentence will be a call to action, explain the moral of the story, give advice related to the topic, or say what we can learn from the characters.</div>
