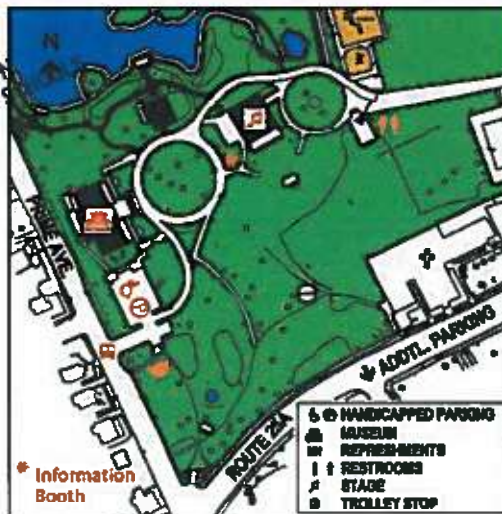

DIRECTIONS TO HUNTINGTON'S HECKSCHER PARK

By Car: I-19 (I-495), Northern or Southern State Parkways to Rt. 110 north. Rt. 110 north to Huntington Village and turn right onto Rt. 25A. East on Rt. 25A to the next traffic signal at Prime Ave. Park is on the NE corner.

Parking: On side streets adjacent to the park and south across Rt. 25A behind Town Hall (from Prime Ave. continue east on Rt. 25A to the next traffic signal and turn right). Handicapped parking is available east of Prime Ave. next to the museum.

By Bus: H6 or H9 HART bus to Prime Ave. & Rt. 25A, or S1 Suffolk Transit bus to Prime Ave. & New York Ave.

By Train: L.I.R.R. from Penn Station to Huntington Station. Heckscher Park is five minutes away by taxi.

Mike Soloway is a teacher and performer of children's music residing in Huntington, NY. His children's recordings include the *Moving With Mike* series and the *Preschool Action Song* series in addition to the albums *Hungry For Manners* and *School Bus Songs*.

Mike has previously performed as part of the Huntington Arts Council's Summer Series and at the Tulip Festival. He was the host of the children's radio show *For The Young and the Young at Heart* which aired for many years on WUSB FM.

Mike performs frequently at many early childhood education centers on Long Island, as well as at area libraries. Mike also presents solo jazz guitar performances regularly at the Cinema Arts Centre of Huntington.

Traditional Music and Dance from the Andes Tahuantinsuyo

Tahuantinsuyo is a pioneer folk music group from the Andes in South America that has helped introduce Andean music and traditions throughout the USA. The group uses regional instruments and costumes during performances of traditional music from the Andean countries that once formed the "Inca Empire," now comprised of Ecuador, Perú, Bolivia, Chile, Argentina and Colombia.

Tahuantinsuyo was founded by its director Guillermo Guerrero (from Ayabaca, a small town in the northern Peruvian Andes) in 1973; other members include Fernando Leyva, John Freire, Andrés Jimenez, Alcides Loza, Saúl Guerrero, Billie Contreras, and Cesar Vele. The group has performed in wide variety of concert halls, universities, museums, libraries, and international folk festivals.

Songs & Puppetry with Janice Buckner

Janice is one of the nation's top performing artists for children. She tours nationally, appearing on over 150 stages each year receiving top ratings. She has appeared on radio and television, as well as over 4000 schools and concert halls. She entertains audiences of all ages with her voice, guitars, puppets and her knowledge of Sign Language for the Deaf. She is noted for her voice, her creativity and the outstanding quality of her lyrics.

Her *Learn Along Song Series* includes eleven CDs & songbooks and her *Creativity in the Classroom Work/Play Book* with a 20-song CD is used by pre-K and elementary school teachers throughout the country. Her *Learn Along* radio show aired out of Hofstra University for seventeen years and was heard around the world via the internet.
