



FOUND OBJECT COLOR WHEEL


Your objective today is to demonstrate your understanding of the color wheel by creating a photograph of objects that are arranged to create an accurate color wheel.

Instructions:

Take a look around your home. Using the objects found in your home, collect as many colored objects as you can to create a color wheel. This is a fun challenge to see how many different objects in different hues you can find in your home.

Steps:

1. View the Color Powerpoint as review. You should understand the color wheel and the following terms: Primary, Secondary, Tertiary Colors



2. Check out artist and object arranger Adam Hillman's colorful creations by reading this article: <https://tettybetty.com/visual-artist-enjoys-organizing-colorful-objects-into-mesmerizing-patterns/> (If you're interested in following his Instagram, his tag is "Witenry.")



3. Walk around your home, garage or yard or all three. Collect objects that illustrate all of the colors on the color wheel. Anything from socks to toys to tooth brushes and kitchen utensils. Be creative!

4. Arrange in a circle on WHITE or NEUTRAL color background. (The floor, counter, sidewalk, driveway, etc)

5. Use your laptop to **photograph** the objects.

6. Take multiple pictures from various angles or lightings

7. Select the strongest picture

8. Save this to your desktop.

9. Upload your picture to the Found Object Color Wheel Discussion in the Materials Section of our Schoology Page. If you're feeling shy, you can attach the photo in an e-mail in Schoology.
