## **Pandemic Response Team**

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### **Health and Safety Procedures**



#### **Facemasks**

- Wearing a face mask is required for everyone while on school or district grounds and on school buses
- No one will be allowed to enter the building without a mask.
- Students and staff must arrive at school with a mask.
- Face masks may be removed when using the restroom or during meal times as long as social distancing is maintained.
- Face masks may be removed if alone and the room is closed.
- Acceptable masks include disposable surgical masks or cloth masks.

#### Stay Home When Sick of Exposed to COVID-19

- Students and staff should stay home if they have:
  - Tested positive (viral test) for COVID-19
  - COVID-19 symptoms
  - Potential exposure to COVID-19
  - Recent close contact (being within 6 feet for at least 10 minutes) with a person with COVID-19 in the past 14 days.
  - Travelled to an area with high levels of COVID-19 transmission in the past 14 days

#### **Entry Procedures**


- Prior to entering any of our facilities or district grounds everyone must wear a mask and undergo a **four step process** which includes the following.
  - Step 1: Symptoms Screening Employees and students will be asked a series of questions regarding their health.
  - Step 2: Temperature Check Employees and students will have their temperature checked using a non contact thermometer. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher will not be permitted into the building.
  - Step 3: Footwear Sanitizing Employees and students will stand in a rubber tub with disinfectant solution to sanitize their shoes. (Everyone must wear closed shoes.)
  - Step 4: Hand Washing/Sanitizing Employees and students will be provided foaming hand sanitizer or will wash their hands with soap and water before entering the building.
- Bus students will be screened for symptoms at the school
- Trained staff will be required to arrive early to check and set up testing stations.
- Staff will be screened at the main entrance






\*students will line up by homeroom after symptom and temperature check. There will be markers for them to remain 6 feet apart from each other

#### **Classroom Guidelines**

- Cohorts of students stay together and are with the same teacher throughout the school day
- Cohorts do not intermingle
- There will be a maximum 10 students in each class
- Student desks will all face the same direction and will be 6 ft apart.
- Students will not share any materials
- Desktop dividers on all student desks
- Signage posted throughout the school to promote social distancing and hand sanitizing.

#### Common Area Protocols (Gym, Cafeteria, Auditorium, etc.)

• These spaces will be used as additional classrooms for social distancing (if necessary)

#### **Student Movement and Hallway Traffic Procedures**

- Main stairwell will be used for going upstairs only
- All other stairwells will be used for going downstairs only
- All staff and students will walk to the right in every hallway

#### Response to students arriving to school with symptoms

- Given the serious health concerns, the parent/guardian(s) MUST adhere to a policy of response, availability and pickup of the ill child.
- Contact parent
- Isolation room (room 107)

## Response to students displaying symptoms during the school day

- Contact parent
- Isolation room (office adjacent to nurse's office)
  - o clear guidelines that dictate the criteria for assignment to an isolation room.
  - Personal protective equipment (PPE) for staff will be provided at all times
  - Siblings in other classes will need to quarantine as well



#### **Protocols/Procedure**

- No outside visitors or random parent visits be permitted within the school confines or classrooms.
- Students may not be picked up early unless it is an emergency.
  - Please schedule medical appointments and other services after instructional time. If, in a rare case, a student needs to be picked up during the day, the parent will be asked to wait outside of the school and the student will be brought outside.
- Adults authorized to pick up students ideally should be restricted to one per family.
- Parent-teacher conferences will be conducted online or by phone.



## Cleaning/Sanitizing

#### **Protocols**

- All classrooms/offices have a hydroxyl air purification system installed
- Increased frequency of cleaning all surfaces, including walls (up to height of students)
- Routinely clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that are frequently touched
- Drinking fountains are turned off
  - o Staff and students should bring their own water
- Cleaning/sanitizing checklist will be completed by the personnel responsible for the cleaning
- All areas used by a sick person will be closed and not used again before cleaning and disinfection
- Custodians have been trained in using specialized equipment
- All surfaces will be cleaned with detergent/hydrogen peroxide cleaner
- Electrostatic equipment and misting sprays will be used throughout the building
- Foaming hand sanitizer will be available throughout the building and in every classroom
- Student supplies will not be shared in the classroom.
  - Each student will be provided with their own set of necessary supplies
  - Supplies will be kept in individual desks or bags and will not come in contact with other students' supplies.



## **Meals & Food Distribution**

#### **Breakfast**

- Students will pick up upon entering the building.
- Buckets will be labeled with bagged items for each class.
- Students will grab and go from their selected bucket upon entry.

#### **Snack**

- Students in grades 3-6 will have a 20 minute snack break
- Weather permitting, teachers will bring students to eat outside

#### Lunch

- Students in grades 3- 6 will grab a bagged lunch as they dismiss at 1:30
- Students in grades Prek-2 will eat in their classrooms.
  - Weather permitting, they will eat outside



## **Social Emotional Learning**

- Morning Meetings prior to the start of each lesson to facilitate opportunities for students to connect and reflect.
- Integrated Social and Emotional classroom lessons through the use of the 2nd Step Curriculum
- Student Support Staff will work with students to address their emotional and academic needs, including Social Workers, School Counselors, Attendance Counselors, etc.
- Refer to Franklin Falcon <u>SEL Communication Plan</u> to ensure vision and mission of SEL Program is carried out by all constituents.
- Refer to Franklin <u>Roadmap</u> during SEL leadership team to ensure goals are being met and adjustments are being made to support virtual learning
- Host monthly staff SEL Meetings, monthly SEL Leadership Team meetings and bi-weekly SEL Champ Teacher meetings to ensure the Implementation plan is fluid and meets the immediate needs of staff and students.
- <u>Virtual Spirit Weeks</u> will occur every week and will be a school-wide collaborative
  effort in designation of activities and events to keep staff and students engaged and
  motivated in learning.

# Multi-Tiered Systems of Support



- Academic Interventions and Supports
  - o K 6 will be assessed utilizing the district screener, Lexia, and ALEKS data.
  - o Small groups have been formed based on assessment data.
  - Designated Intervention time build in schedules for remote and in person instruction.
  - Each grade level has an identified staff member who pulls groups remotely in a virtual classroom.
  - o Groups will remain fluid based on student needs formative assessment data and teacher input.
- Student Support and Behavioral Intervention
  - All Staff will be trained on SEL/PBIS practices outlined in the Falcon Handbook.
  - School-wide PBIS Falcon Bucks system has been implemented in school and virtually.
    - Schoolwide PBIS Falcon Buck assembly occurred to review expectations, and procedures for being safe, kind, and respectful in school and virtually.
  - o K 6 Implementation of SAEBRS (Social, Academic, Emotional, Behavior Risk Screener)
    - Survey Results support Tier 2 virtual groups.
      - K 2 (Ms. Barerra)
      - 3 6 (Ms. Parr)
  - 3-6 Implementation of REthink
    - Survey Results support Tier 2 virtual groups with Ms. Parr



## **Wraparound Supports**

- The district will continue to partner with organizations to provide resources to support students and families with wraparound services in the following areas:
  - Mental health supports (Jersey Cares, Greater Life, etc.)
  - Primary Health Care and Dental Care (JRMC, Rutgers Medical, etc.)
  - Family Engagement (ESL for adults, Surveys in multiple languages)
  - Academic Enrichment (Summer Programming, Extended School Day, etc.)
  - Mentoring (Mentor Newark, Leadership Newark, etc.)
  - Quarantine Tutors (free tutoring to support virtual learning)
