

#### RECOMMENDATION

Homestead High School places **NO LIMIT** on the number of Honors and AP courses students can take. Students interested in Honors or AP courses should **consider three to be the normal maximum** number to be taken concurrently in order to optimize learning.

Students may certainly enroll in more than three such courses. However, students **considering taking more than three** Honors or AP courses at the same time need to do the following:

- Be sure you have met all the prerequisites for the courses you are considering
- Check with your counselor
- Consult with your current teacher(s)
- Discuss the decision with your parents

Participation in advanced coursework should not be taken lightly. As such, students are encouraged to collaborate with teachers, counselors, parents, etc. when making course requests annually.
