

- 5 Buildings Klein Classroom Center, The Commons, The Lab Center, The Student Activities Center, & The Memorial Gym


### STUDENT SERVICE CENTERS

### 26 Credits are required for graduation

- English 4 credits
- Social Studies 3 credits
- Science and Math 7 credits
- Health 1 credit
- Physical Education 2 credits
- Fine & Practical Arts 1 credit
- Freshman and Sophomore Seminar 1 credit
- Computer Science .5 credit
- Community Service 0.5 credits (60 hrs)
- General Electives 5 credits
  - Note: If college-bound, 3 Foreign Language credits are recommended
- Satisfactory demonstration of proficiency in Algebra, Literature (grade 10), and Biology.



### Prior to Admission:

- 1. Student must express intent to enroll in the course
  - Letters of intent available online
  - DUE March 15th
- 2. Student willingness to meet the rigors of the course
- 3. Data review with focus on advanced or proficient standardized test results, final course grades, and attendance.
- 4. LHS sends course verifications in May


