BIRTHPLACE OF FRISBEE

FRED MORRISON DISCOVERED A MARKET FOR THE MODERN DAY FRISBEE

IN 1938 HIS WIFE AND HIM WERE OFFERED 25 CENTS FOR A CAKE PAN THEY WERE THROWING ON A BEACH IN LOS ANGELES, THE CAKE PAN ORIGINALLY COST THEM 5 CENTS

HE THEN CREATED SEVERAL PROTOTYPES, FINALLY HE NAMED THEM THE FLYIN SAUCER

IN 1955 HE DESIGNED A NEW TYPE OF SAUCER CALLED THE PLUTO PLATER WHICH WAS THEN BOUGHT BY WHAM-O TOYS



THE "NEW" FRISBEE

WHAM-O TOYS DECIDED TO CHANGE THE NAME OF THE PLUTO PLATTER TO THE FRISBEE IN 1957.

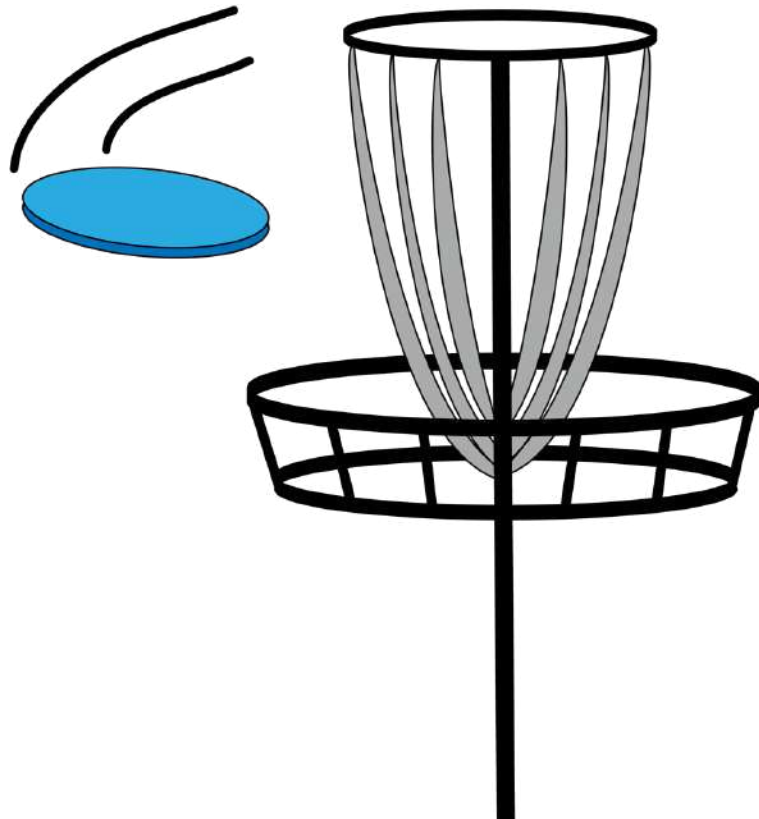
THE FRISBEE WAS REBORN WITH A MORE MOLDED SHAPE AND DEEPER RIM FOR BETTER GRIP

DISC GOLF: A PRECISION AND ACCURACY GAME BASED ON THE OUTLINE OF THE SPORT OF GOLF USING A FRISBEE



ULTIMATE FRISBEE: MOST WIDELY PLAYED FRISBEE GAME INVENTED IN THE 1960S. THE OBJECT OF THE GAME IS TO MOVE THE GAME DOWN THE COURT OR FIELD AND SCORE IN AN END ZONE WITHOUT DROPPING THE FRISBEE
