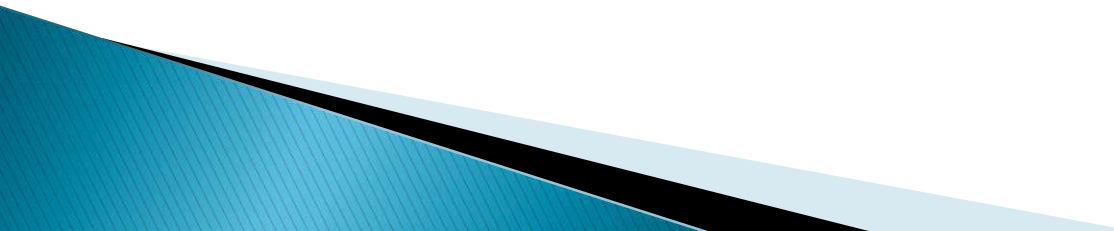

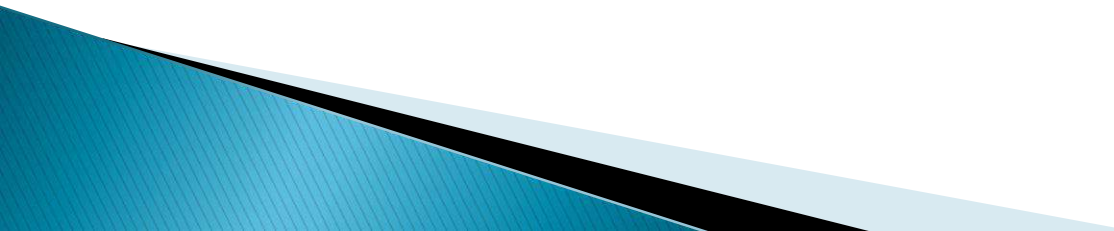

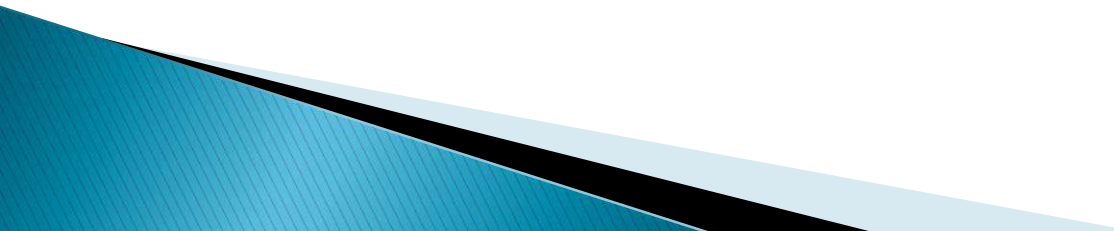

Drop Off Lane

- ▶ FRMS has a new drop off lane.
- ▶ Please pull forward to the marked area to drop off students and have them cross in the crosswalk to enter the building.



Drop Off and Pick Up of Students

- ▶ Students are not allowed in the building until 7:50.
 - ▶ Students getting picked up should be picked up by 3:30. There is no student supervision provided after school.
 - ▶ Students cannot wait at school for practice unless an adult coach or assistant coach is here to supervise. Students must leave the building when the bell rings. They can wait for their coach at the front of the school.
 - ▶ We ask parents to please follow our parking lot procedures for dropping off students.
 - ▶ If you want your child's afterschool plans to change, please contact the office before 1:00.

What is Home Room?

- ▶ 15 minutes a week
 - ▶ Not a class
 - ▶ Grade level groups
 - ▶ Smaller Numbers
 - ▶ Focus on PBIS training, expect respect, anti-bullying activities, character education, etc.
 - ▶ Home Room might be lead by a classroom teacher or a school administrator or an instructional assistant
 - ▶ Home Room is also the time to find out more about school events and activities

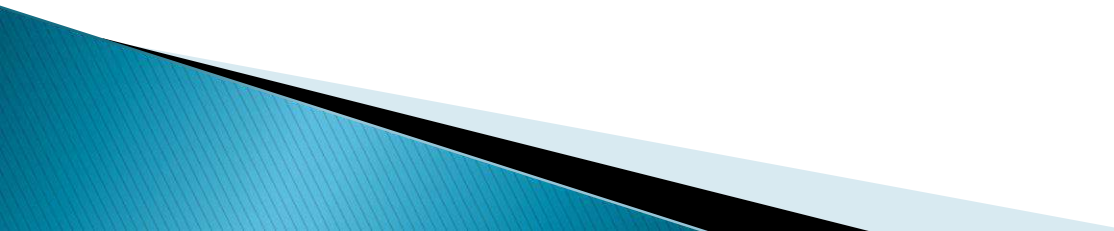
Attendance

Did you know that missing more than 2 days of school a month for any reason means your child is chronically absent?

► Research tells us

- Middle grade attendance and GPA provide the best indication of future high school performance.
- Students who are chronically absent or receiving F's in Middle School are at high risk of dropping out of high school.
- Improving grades and attendance in middle school will have a greater pay off on improving high school success than just increasing test scores.

If your child is absent....

- ▶ For less than two days, they can pick up their missing assignments when they return.
 - ▶ Call the office as early in the day as possible to excuse their absence.
 - ▶ Absences longer than three days, please request missing work.
 - ▶ Parents can check **Home Access** to make sure missing work has been turned in, put into the grade, and their child has caught up.

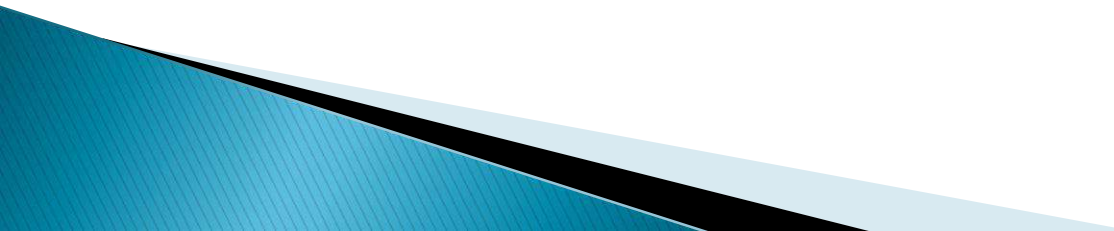

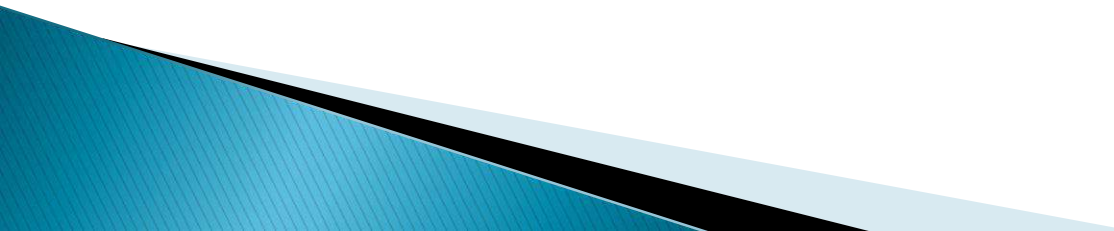

PBIS Rewards

- ▶ **No tardies?** Students can participate monthly in Free Fridays at the end of the day where they get treats or social time.
- ▶ **No detentions or referrals?** They get a Gold Star Activity at the end of each quarter—dances, pool parties, assemblies, etc.
- ▶ **High Five Tickets Earned for Good Behavior**
 - Can be spent in the Student Store weekly
 - Can be used at the High Five Assembly each quarter
 - Can be used for High Five drawings for special prizes throughout the school year
 - Can be used to “buy” High Five privileges like five minutes longer at lunch on special High Five days.

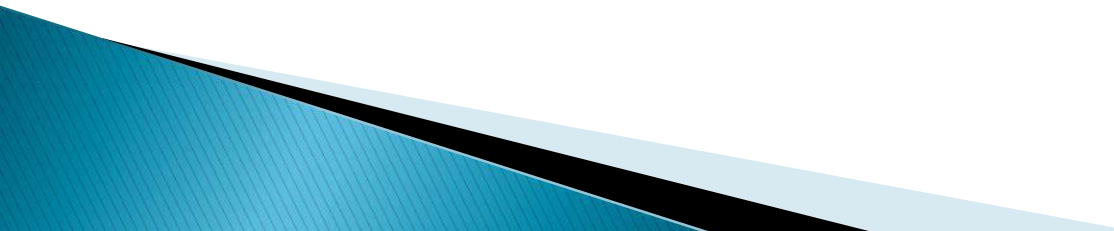

Home Access

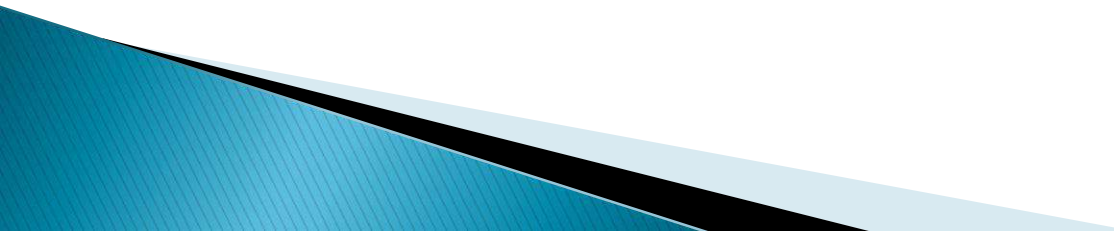
- ▶ Find Home Access Link on the right hand side of the FRMS website under Quick Links.
- ▶ To access your student's Eschool information, the **user ID** is their first name, dot, last name or "first.last". For example olivia.johnson
- ▶ Your student's home school password is their Student ID # and date of birth. Their ID # is also their lunch number. Most students have it memorized, but if you need it feel free to call the office.

- ▶ Home Access can tell you how they are doing in their classes, how they are doing behaviorally, and what their attendance looks like

Homework Blog

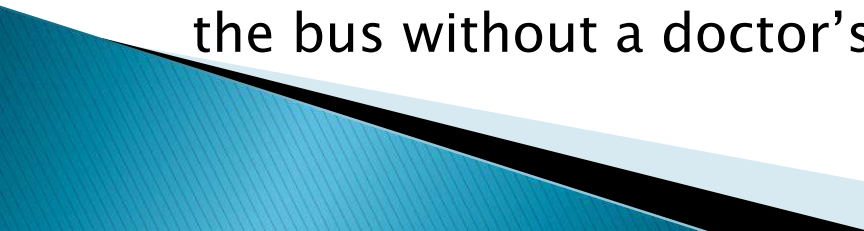
- ▶ Click on Daily Homework under Quick Links on the Fern Ridge Middle School website.

Planners

All students should be using their planners to record assignments, keep track of upcoming tests, and to generally stay organized. Planners should be signed by parents on Thursdays



Medication/Health Room Reminders

- ▶ Meds must be checked in with the office
 - ▶ Meds must be in the original bottle or box with the prescription on the label
 - ▶ Over the counter meds must be in the original container and unopened.
 - ▶ Students who need to carry an inhaler or an epi-pen must have a medical protocol from their doctor stating that they need to self-carry and that they can self-administer.
 - ▶ Students who are sick, need to come to the health office. We will take their temperature, let them rest, get them ice, etc. If after 15 minutes or so they still don't feel well enough to be in class, we will call home. Students who are too sick to be in class should be home under the care of a family member.
 - ▶ Students cannot keep medications on them or take them on the bus without a doctor's statement.
