Process Leading to Vote on Student Assignment to Waddell

Superintendent, through his designees, gathers community input and feedback

- typically, 3 engagement sessions
- session 1 introduces the opportunity, shares information to set context for future engagement and decision-making
- session 2 shares at least two scenarios and seeks community feedback
- session 3 previews the superintendent's recommendation to the Board and seeks community feedback

Community Input and Feedback shared with the superintendent and Board

- at least one public update to the Board during a regularly scheduled Board meeting
- at least one public hearing during a regularly scheduled Board meeting

Multiple Inputs to the Superintendent's Recommendation and Board's Vote

- Policy JCA
- community input
- achieving 2017 bond intent

Superintendent makes recommendation to the Board for a vote ~June / July 2021

- effective date 2022-23 school year
- · grandfathering, if applicable
- specifies new boundaries, including any changes in feeder pattern / continuation


Board's Additional Factors for Consideration (Policy JCA-E2)

- the feasibility of achieving the board's goals through other means, such as establishing partial magnet schools;
- keeping entire neighborhoods assigned to the same school;
- projections for population growth and demographic shifts;
- site limitations or legal restrictions that affect expansion capabilities;
- whether the school has been identified for capital improvements through bond or other funding.



E.E. Waddell High School

- The current E.E. Waddell K-8 Language Academy will move to a new facility for fall 2021. After a year of minor upfitting, E.E. Waddell will reopen as a high school for fall 2022.
- E.E. Waddell is a 71 classroom facility which can support up to 1,775 high school students
- E.E. Waddell is located in the Blue Transportation Zone and sits in the Harding High School attendance area
- Given two new relief high schools, Olympic Relief scheduled to open fall 2022 and South Charlotte relief scheduled to open fall 2024, CMS does not anticipate the need for Waddell HS to include a home school attendance area
- The 2017 bond references opening Waddell as a high school magnet program






EE Waddell Survey Q1 – Who Responded


Current High School Attendance Area for Your Home Address

EE Waddell Survey – Appeal of Each Magnet Theme






Scenarios



E.E. Waddell Magnet High School

- In each scenario, Waddell is a full magnet school serving the Blue and, in some instances, the Green transportation zones
- Students will apply to attend the school via the annual school choice lottery
- Seats are allocated in the lottery based on several priorities including proximity, SES, and transportation zone
- Younger siblings are guaranteed a seat when their older siblings are enrolled in the school
- Students with continuation from a similarly themed magnet middle school are also guaranteed a seat
- Students within a 1/3 mile radius of the school receive a priority in the school choice lottery



Scenarios – In Each, Waddell is a Full Magnet High School

Scenario 1 – Waddell houses two magnet programs, each with approximately 800 students*

Scenario 2 – Waddell house three magnet programs, each with approximately 550 - 600 students*

Programs Under Consideration

- Cambridge
- STEM / CTE
 - STEM programs would provide continuation for students who attend Kennedy STEM Middle and Rea Farms STEAM K-8
- World Languages
 - The world languages magnet would provide continuation for students who attend K-8 language programs in the Blue and Green transportation zones.

Cambridge

- Flexible and academically rigorous curriculum that emphasizes critical-thinking skills and inquiry-based learning while fostering student creativity and engagement.
- Students make take courses toward a Cambridge International Diploma, or focus on courses within a particular area of interest
- More than 470 colleges and universities across the United States recognize Cambridge exams for credit,
 placement and admissions, which is an added bonus for our students who are college-bound
- Cambridge develops learner knowledge, understanding and skills in:
 - Subject content
 - Applying knowledge and understanding to new as well as familiar situations
 - Intellectual enquiry
 - Flexibility and responsiveness to change
 - Influencing outcomes
 - Cultural awareness
- Wide range of courses offered, including world languages and STEM-related courses



STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math)

- CMS offers multiple Career & Technical Education (CTE) pathways aligned to industry credentials as well as 2and 4-year degree programs; several pathways offer articulated credit with CPCC.
- CTE pathways are a 4-5 course sequences where the 4th and/or 5th course are often Advanced Placement (AP) or dual enrollment (with CPCC) courses.
- Students learn in hands-on and project-based environments. Work-based learning opportunities, such as employer site visits and internships, are a key component of each pathway.
- Pathways under consideration for Waddell include
 - App Development & Web Design
 - Digital Marketing
 - Biomedical Science
 - Architecture & Engineering






World Languages

- Languages offered include Chinese, French, German, Japanese and Spanish
- In addition to language study, students engage in learning about the history and culture of the countries and people who speak these languages
- Students who continue from green and blue transportation zone K-8 language programs may enter already having earned high school credit for languages
 - Charlotte East Language Academy (Spanish)*
 - Collinswood Language Academy (Spanish)
 - South Academy of International Languages / formerly Waddell Language Academy (Chinese, French, German, Japanese)
- Other students may be new to language study and begin their journey at 9th grade



World Languages – South Mecklenburg and Myers Park

- The world languages magnet would move from South Mecklenburg High School to E.E. Waddell, relieving South Mecklenburg of approximately 850 students
- The created capacity at South Mecklenburg HS would create the opportunity to provide partial relief to Myers Park HS.
 - The Sharon ES, Carmel MS and Myers Park HS feeder pattern would shift to Sharon ES, Carmel MS, South Mecklenburg HS. Approximately 207 high school students live in this portion of the Myers Park attendance area today.
 - The Olde Providence ES, Carmel MS and Myers
 Park HS feeder pattern would shift to Olde
 Providence ES, Carmel MS, South Mecklenburg
 HS. Approximately 332 high school students
 live in this portion of the Myers Park attendance
 area today.
 - No changes to elementary or middle school assignments would take place




Existing Feeder Patterns and Distribution of HS Students





World Languages



International Baccalaureate (IB) (visit www.cmschoice.org for more information)

Focuses on critical thinking and international mindedness, seeking to develop the whole child intellectually, personally, socially and emotionally.

IB teaches students to ask challenging questions, reflect, develop research skills and become active learners.

IB schools evaluated and authorized by the International Baccalaureate Organization in order to receive the designation of an IB World School (www.ibo.org).

IB Primary Years Programme (PYP): For grades K-5, PYP focuses on inquiry-based learning, emphasizing academic development, international understanding and service to society. Study of world languages begins in Kindergarten.

IB Middle Years Programme (MYP): For grades 6-10, MYP focuses on an intensive study of core subjects integrating concept based learning through global contexts.

IB Diploma Programme (DP): For grades 11-12, DP is among the most academically rigorous programs offered in high school. Students sit for international exams to earn the IB Diploma, a highly esteemed qualification widely recognized by institutions of higher learning.



STEM and STEAM (visit www.cmschoice.org for more information)

Integrates the content and skills of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

STEAM fuses arts and creativity with STEM.

Focuses on inquiry, logical reasoning, and investigation; complements 21st century skills, particularly creativity, collaboration, critical thinking, communication.

Special Features

- Specially trained teachers for STEM/ STEAM studies
- Students discover the 'how' and 'why' behind the creative processes

Areas of Focus - some schools choose to focus on a particular area within STEM

- Environmental sustainability
- Computer science / coding
- Health and epidemiology



Traditional / Leadership (visit www.cmschoice.org for more information)

Develops young citizens to possess leadership skills nurtured within and demonstrated openly in service and responsibility to self, family, community, and country.

Using the Leader in Me model, the program builds cooperative relationships and good judgment as the basis for creating a successful community of learners characterized by principle-centered and personal leadership.

Special Features

- The principles of Dr. Stephen R. Covey, internationally renowned consultant and author of the 7 Habits of
 Highly Effective People and First Things First, are embedded in the school's culture and guide the students,
 faculty and staff in building the leadership model.
- At Quail Hollow Middle, the traditional / leadership theme is paired with the Paideia model, which leverages the Socratic seminar to advance "critical thinking, communication skills, and attitudes necessary to earn a living, be an active citizen, and pursue a meaningful life"



Visual and Performing Arts (visit www.cmschoice.org for more information)

Develops a student's talents and passion for the arts. Students receive specialized studies in dance, music, theatre arts, and visual arts with arts used a catalyst for creativity and collaboration.

Elementary level - Students receive weekly classes in each of the four arts disciplines, as well as arts integrated instruction in their grade-based classroom.

Middle school level - three consecutive years of rigorous, intensive instruction in the visual and performing arts with flexible, skill-based groupings in the visual and performing arts.

High school level – offers several four-year programs of study is a particular arts discipline

Special Features

- Student performance opportunities available at all levels
- Visiting artists and guest speakers
- Full time band and orchestra classes (K-5)



World Languages — (visit <u>www.cmschoice.org</u> for more information)

Promotes high achievement in reading, writing and speaking in dual languages, while enhancing the level of cultural awareness among students. Students learn a new language or retain high proficiency in a heritage language, embrace diversity and become responsible leaders in a culturally diverse world.

Language Immersion

Students have the opportunity to become highly proficient in Chinese, French, German, Japanese, or Spanish by participating in the elementary Language Immersion program. Beginning in kindergarten, classroom instruction is conducted in the target language for all or part of the instructional day.

World Languages

Students select to study Chinese, French, German, Japanese or Spanish beginning at the entry level in grade 6 and have the opportunity to earn high school credit while in middle school.

Special Features

- participation in local international events
- opportunities to become proficient in a 2nd or 3rd language
- K-8 curriculum taught in a target language
- 6-12 instruction builds on existing language proficiency, emphasizing world languages and cultures



Career and Technical Education (visit www.discovercte.com for more information)

In addition to magnet themes, CMS offers an array of CTE pathways

Each pathway is a 4-5 course sequence, articulated to industry credentials, 2- and 4- year degree programs, and high demand careers. Students participate in project-based learning in state of the art labs and have opportunities to engage in internships.





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
