- What color is the "Oil Pressure" light? What does it warn you about? Does it require your immediate attention?
 Red. Your car is low on oil. Yes.
- 2. What information does the "Odometer" provide? Tells you how many total miles the vehicle has been driven.
- 3. Describe the Standard Reference Point for the Right Side Limit. The center of the hood
- 4. Describe the Standard Reference Point for the Front Limit. The corner posts or under outside rear view mirrors
- 5. How does the use of reference points help you to overcome the optical illusions created by the blind zone, the body of the vehicle blocking your view of the ground? They tell you where the car really is in relationship to its surroundings.

 - 1. They show you exactly where the left and right side tires are tracking on the roadway and help you to make reduced-risk lane position adjustments in any lane.
