## Principal's Message

MJ Community,

Each morning, one of the first things I do is take my dog, Bear, out for his morning jaunt around the neighborhood. Over the past couple of weeks, those walks have become much more invigorating due to the cold. The frost has begun to settle in more frequently and the wind has become more cutting. I mention this because as we move into the winter months, I wanted to highlight some of the policies and procedures that help us safely navigate the weather during the colder months of the school year.

Please remember that students go outside, even in snowy weather, unless it is an unsafe temperature. For Westwood Public Schools, students will stay inside if the temperature is below 20 degrees Fahrenheit. Students will also not have outside recess if the conditions are too icy or rainy. Please make sure your children are dressed for the winter temperatures, so they can play outside comfortably and safely.

On snowy days, please make sure your children are equipped with snow pants and snow boots. Without this gear, students will need to play on the shoveled blacktop areas of the playground, which is a lot less fun than playing in the snow on the field or playground. Please send your children to school with a pair of shoes in addition to snow boots. It is also helpful to send an extra

pair of shoes with your children on and after rainy days. This will help students stay comfortable and keep our hallways and classrooms clean and dry throughout the day.

# News from 3La (Mrs. Lane)













The "super sleuths" in 3 Lane had to collaborate with their fellow "detectives" to solve the mystery in their book group. They identified the crime, analyzed clues, connected the clues to suspects and discussed motives and opportunities. They designed a detective board to highlight the elements of their investigation which they used to retell the story.

# News from 2M (Ms. Mundy)









In Ms. Mundy's class, students have been studying the work of water in creating and changing the Earth's surface. Erosion is the process in which pieces of earth, like rocks, pebbles, and sand, are worn away and transported by natural forces, like water and wind.

In a recent lesson, students made models of mountains using cornmeal and created "rain" using a dripstick. Partners worked together using materials like aluminum foil, cotton balls, paper towel strips, and toothpicks to design a method of preventing their mountain from eroding after a "rainfall". The students were excited to find that most of their erosion prevention models were successful!

# News from PE (Mr. Foley)













In grades K-2, the physical education curriculum focuses on movement education. Movement education is a series of movement experiences utilized to develop confidence and proficiency in coordination and body control. When children explore through movement, it gives them a better understanding of these concepts and skills.

To develop these important skills, the students are introduced to a wide variety of movement games and activities. In kindergarten, students explore their own space by creating different body shapes and balances. By first and second grade, students are challenged to move to an open space and change speeds, levels, directions, and pathways. These games and activities are both enjoyable and developmentally beneficial.

The children pictured are getting a chance to work with a variety of movement equipment. They are having lots of fun creating different ways of traveling and demonstrating body control in "open space".
