

DIRECTIONS

Although each entrepreneur comes from a different background with different experiences, these entrepreneurs share many characteristics, traits and skills that helped make them successful.

1. CHOOSE AN ENTREPRENEUR

You will have the opportunity to research an entrepreneur to battle in the WHO IS THE G.O.A.T. ENTREPRENEUR? You will create a presentation about a successful entrepreneur of your choosing that you think is the greatest of all time and try to convince the class of why! You may create a movie, slideshow, poster, skit, infographic, website, social media page, book, podcast, collage board, article, animation, etc. – as long as it can be presented to the class on Google Classroom (ask if you have an idea you aren't sure about!)

Choose an entrepreneur from either the list provided OR choose one from your own knowledge. You must get your entrepreneur approved with your teacher... no two people may choose the same entrepreneur to present over.

2. RESEARCH

You must include the following topics in your presentation:

- Background History of Entrepreneur
- Distinctive Entrepreneurial Qualities
- History of their Business (From start to its success)
- Why YOU think they are the G.O.A.T.

3. CITE YOUR SOURCES

You must use *at least* 2 different sources for your presentation. You must include your sources cited somewhere on your presentation.

4. PRESENT

You will present your famous entrepreneur to the class. The class will take notes and ultimately decide who they think the greatest entrepreneur of all time is!
