Individual Student Alternative Education Plan (ISAEP) program

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Course Description and Overview

The Individual Student Alternative Education Plan (ISAEP) program is designed to give students a choice for completing “high School.” Students enrolled in the ISAEP/General Education Development (GED) are placed based on eligibility.

A student is eligible for enrollment in the ISAEP program if the student:

- is currently enrolled in a public high school
- is at least 16 years of age
- is at risk of dropping out of school
- is not earning the required number of credits to earn a traditional high school diploma
- meets the ISAEP academic entrance requirements
- chooses to prepare for the GED® test.

Student’s enrollment requirements for the program include the following:

- an initial meeting with student, parent, and principal or designee
- a student evaluation /assessment
- a 7.5 grade equivalent or higher on a recognized standardized measure of reading achievement
- achievement of a score of 125 or higher on each of the of the four GED Ready™ practice subtests
- completion of a career assessment

Once a student meets the enrollment requirements, the development of the ISAEP is undertaken in a second meeting.

Students enrolled in ISAEP are required to attend school Monday-Friday and times are based on individual needs. Transportation will be provided by Brunswick County for all students.

All students enrolled in the GED program will complete a practice test prior to completing the official GED test. The GED Ready practice test will identify the areas in which students need improvement.

Students taking the GED Official test must do so online at Southside Virginia Community College, Alberta, VA. In order to register for the GED Official test all students must have a DMV Identification card and a working email account.

There are four subtests on the GED test. The subtests are as follows:

- Reasoning through Language Arts
- Mathematical Reasoning
- Science
- Social Studies

To receive a GED all students must score at least 145 on each subtest. The price to take the official GED test is free to any student who receives a score of 145 on the GED Ready Practice Test.

The GED class will be working virtually during the first nine weeks of the 2020-2021 academic school year. We will be using various websites to communicate and complete assignments.
