Story Overview

You are ready for change. A new job is just the kind of change you need. You have scoped out and found the perfect job for you and your skill set. But first, you must make it through the application phase. You are one of a large pool of applicants, so in order to be chosen for the position you need to ensure all your application documents are in order and the interview goes perfectly. Will you get the job?

Setup Instructions:

STEPS	
1	<i>Print out and hide "Classifieds" page, resume, and cover letter.</i>
2	<i>Using invisible ink marker, write arrows next to lines of text on the resume. Make sure the arrows stay in order as you move down the page.</i>
3	<i>Hide the hint card and the blacklight flashlight in the 3-digit lock box.</i>
4	<i>Inside big locked box, hide the "Congratulations!" pages (print from Drive folder)</i>
5	<i>Locks used:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- 3 digit lock box- 4-digit lock- Word lock- Direction lock

Game Flow Template

Each game should have a series of puzzles, clues or mysteries that the players are trying to solve. Most games have 5 to 10 puzzles. For each challenge, you need to consider how the players may logically solve the puzzle. Briefly describe each puzzle and how they will figure out how to solve it.

<p>Puzzle 1:</p> <p>Players will find a copy of job classifieds hidden in the room</p> <p>Included on the job classifieds page is a QR code, which leads to a PDF of a job description.</p> <p>How will they know: The QR code is visible on the classifieds - embedded into a job listing.</p>	<p>Puzzle 2:</p> <p>Players will find a clue to the 3-digit small lock box in the job description; box holds blacklight and hint card</p> <p>Code: 2-2-4</p> <p>How will they know: These are the only numbers in the job description that are not spelled out in words. These numbers are also bolded.</p>	<p>Puzzle 3:</p> <p>A copy of a resume is hidden in the room, which contains invisible ink direction lock</p> <p>Code: U-U-D-L-R-D</p> <p>How will they know: Players will use the blacklight to view the direction lock written on the resume</p>	<p>Puzzle 4:</p> <p>Players will need to find a cover letter hidden in the room; text in cover letter includes a fake company website; players visit the website which is actually a digital jigsaw puzzle containing a QR code to a Google Form. Upon correct completion of the form (answer questions about resumes/interviews), players will receive a specific clue for the word lock.</p> <p>Code: MONEY</p> <p>How will they know: The clue revealed for the word lock - "think about what is acceptable to negotiate after getting the job offer!"</p>
<p>Puzzle 5:</p> <p>A final QR code appears at the beginning of the Google Form that leads to a list of typical interview questions; four of the questions include numbers</p> <p>Code: 3-3-5-3</p> <p>How will they know: The 4-digit lock is made up of the four numbers in the interview questions;</p>			

the four numbers will be the only ones written in numerical form on the page (other numbers are spelled out completely).
