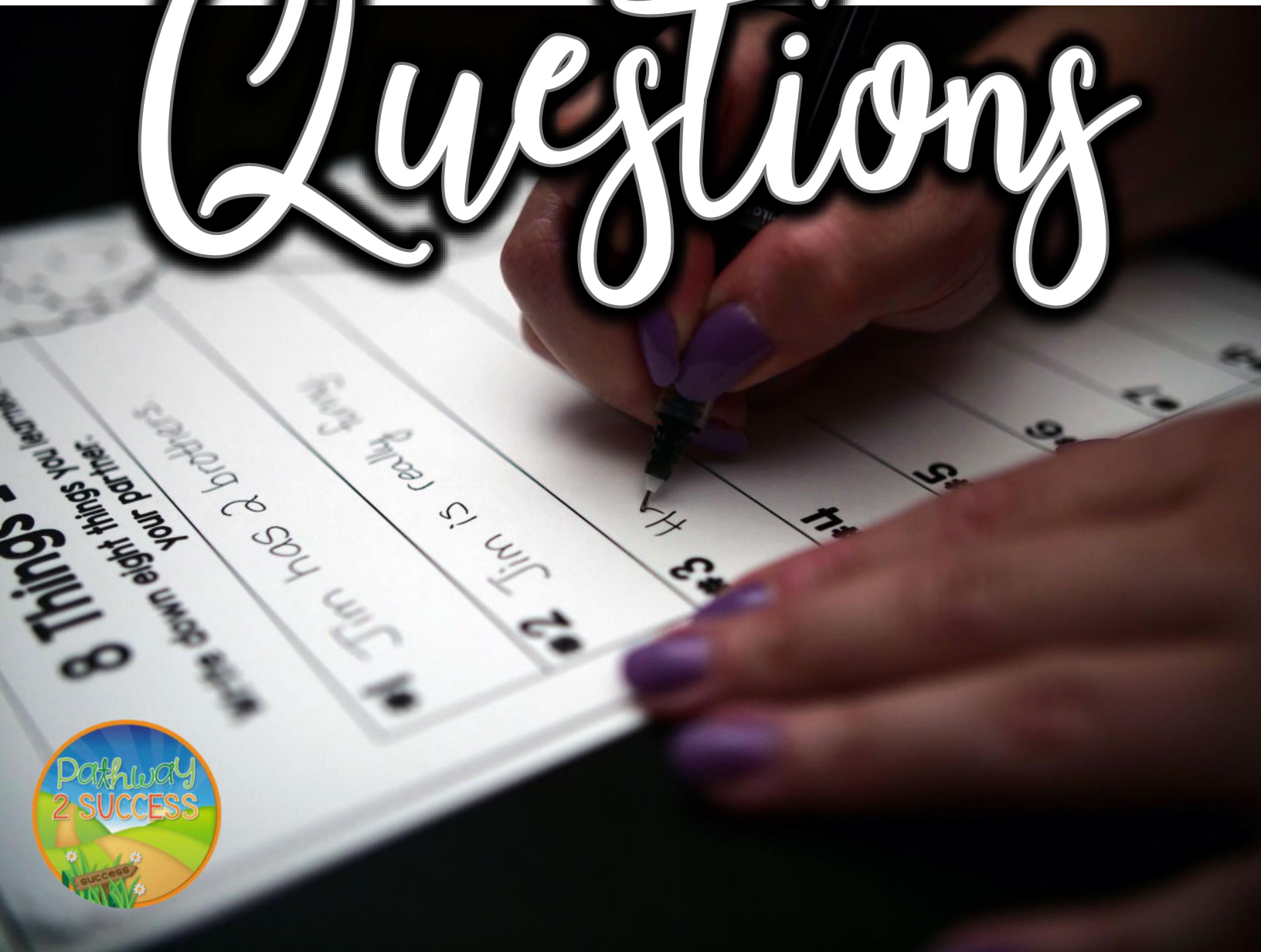
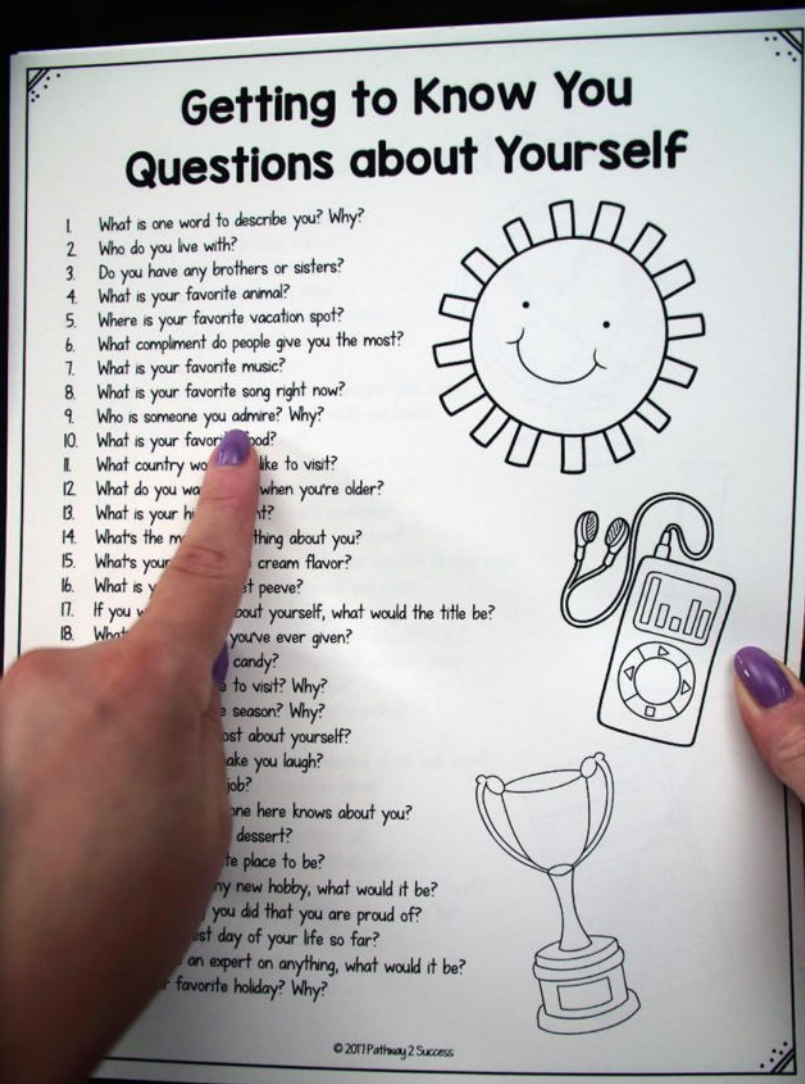


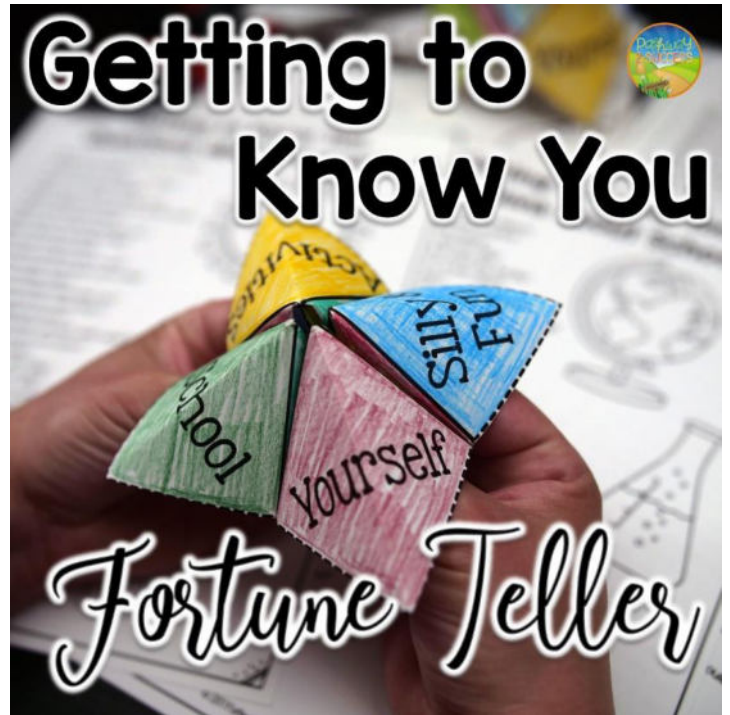

Getting to Know You Fortune Teller

If you like this resource, consider purchasing the [Getting to Know You Fortune Teller](#). Kids use sets of getting to know you lists (with over 120 questions) to write in their personally chosen questions for partners. Then, kids write those questions in the fortune teller, color it, cut it out, and put it together. Kids will then work with a partner (or more than 1 partner, if you choose) to ask and answer questions about themselves in the fortune tellers.

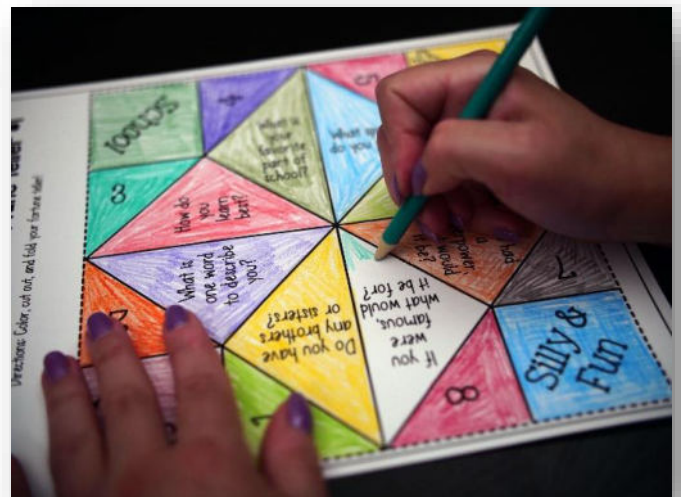


Finally, kids will write down what they've learned about their classmates in an organizer. Several different organizers are included so you can choose the one that works best.

It's a fun getting to know you craft that involves following directions, writing, working with others, and more. Check it out here:

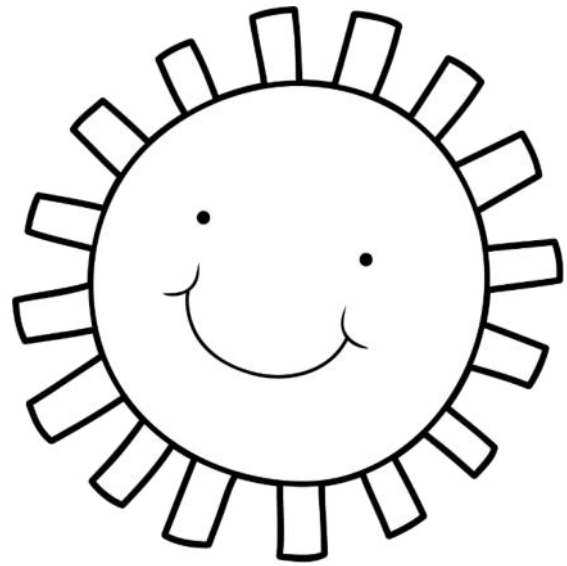
