Topic G. Comparison of Numerals


#### Words to know

#### Objective

### OBJECTIVE OF TOPIC G


- 1 Match and count to compare a number of objects. State which quantity is more.

Comparison of Numerals


In Lesson 25, students will work with linear configurations to match and count to compare a number and state which quantity is more.

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
4 is more than 3.
