What type of short story as a troop do you want?


Mystery Humor Adventure

After-School Creative Writing Program


This program was done over the span of 6 weeks, 6 program days total.

Day 1:


- 1. Table tents, take a pre-made table tent and write your name in marker, that way I can learn everybody's name, and that way you can learn people's names in different grades.
- 2. Share about yourself, say your name, grade, and favorite part of your winter break.
- 3. Grab a notebook, decorate it with stickers, and add your name too.

Just a few things to go over

- There are no bad ideas and the sky's the limit
- Be kind if someone asks for feedback
- If you are stuck about what to write about the teachers are happy to help you
- Write about what you want, there are no assignments, just optional activities to help you get writing
- You do not need to write only stories, you can write newspapers, comic books, scripts, any style you would like to write!
- 4. You can start writing something like a new story, or something you have been working on for a bit. If you do not know what to write, I can guide you through mind mapping to brainstorm for a writing piece.

- 4. Here are some prompts if you want some inspiration before writing,


Prompt 1

Imagine a world that everything is opposite, what would it be like?






Day 3:

If you want to try something new, you can write about the story behind the images.






Day 4:

Day 5:


1. Welcome everyone, once you come in feel free to eat your snack. Today we are having a guest speaker, ——, a published author. Consider some questions you may want to ask

- her about being an author and what questions could help you in your process of writing. If you want to, you can pick a specific part of your writing to show —- and she can help by giving feedback.
- 2. Make sure to grab your nametags with your notebooks, that way —-- knows your name.
- 3. Today we are going to have a Q + A section with everyone and some time for Ms. —— to come around and talk to you if you want individually. Continue writing and if you want to, you have the option when Ms.—— comes to you to individually ask a question or to show her a short bit of writing.

Day 6:

- 1. Welcome everyone, once you come in feel free to eat your snack. Grab your notebook + table tent and find a spot to write.
- 2. This is our last meeting, but that does not mean your stories must be over. Writers do not usually finish something in six days. You can continue writing whenever you want.
- 3. Reflect on some of the things Ms. ——— told you about being a writer and try applying them to your work. And remember to have fun!

3. Ice Breaker




4. Notebooks

Tall Tale/ Story: Often times the story is often unbelievable to ever to have actually have happened and is meant to be funny.




Babe the blue ox

A Tall Tale of Paul Bunyan


