



Raise the Roof: Adverbs

An **adverb** is a word that adds to the meaning of and describes a verb or adjective.

Example:

McPufferson quickly ran over to Zapp to tell him some new facts about ants.

How did McPufferson run? He ran **quickly**.

Quickly is the adverb; it describes the verb, run.
