In order to participate and remain on the team, the girls must maintain a certain level of academic and behavioral success. In addition to their work with the Step Team, the girls volunteer for Give to the Troops, tutored elementary students at W.H. Robinson Elementary School, and have also raised money in order to attend the area competitions.
- Clarissa Lee and Kate Lawson's fifth grade class at *Elmhurst Elementary School* are the proud winners of the 2009 Conference USA Classroom on the Court Program! They partnered with East Carolina University Women Basketball Team and attended the most home games. During the games they completed an educational worksheet that contained math and geography skills. Because they had the highest participation at the games they were awarded the following: 70 sport elite water bottles, 2 ball pumps, 2 team elite all court basketballs, 1 T90 strike soccer ball, 2 Nike youth footballs, 1 sport agility web, 2 sets of Nike speed discs, 2 Nike speed ropes and 1 Sparq training eye react ball.
