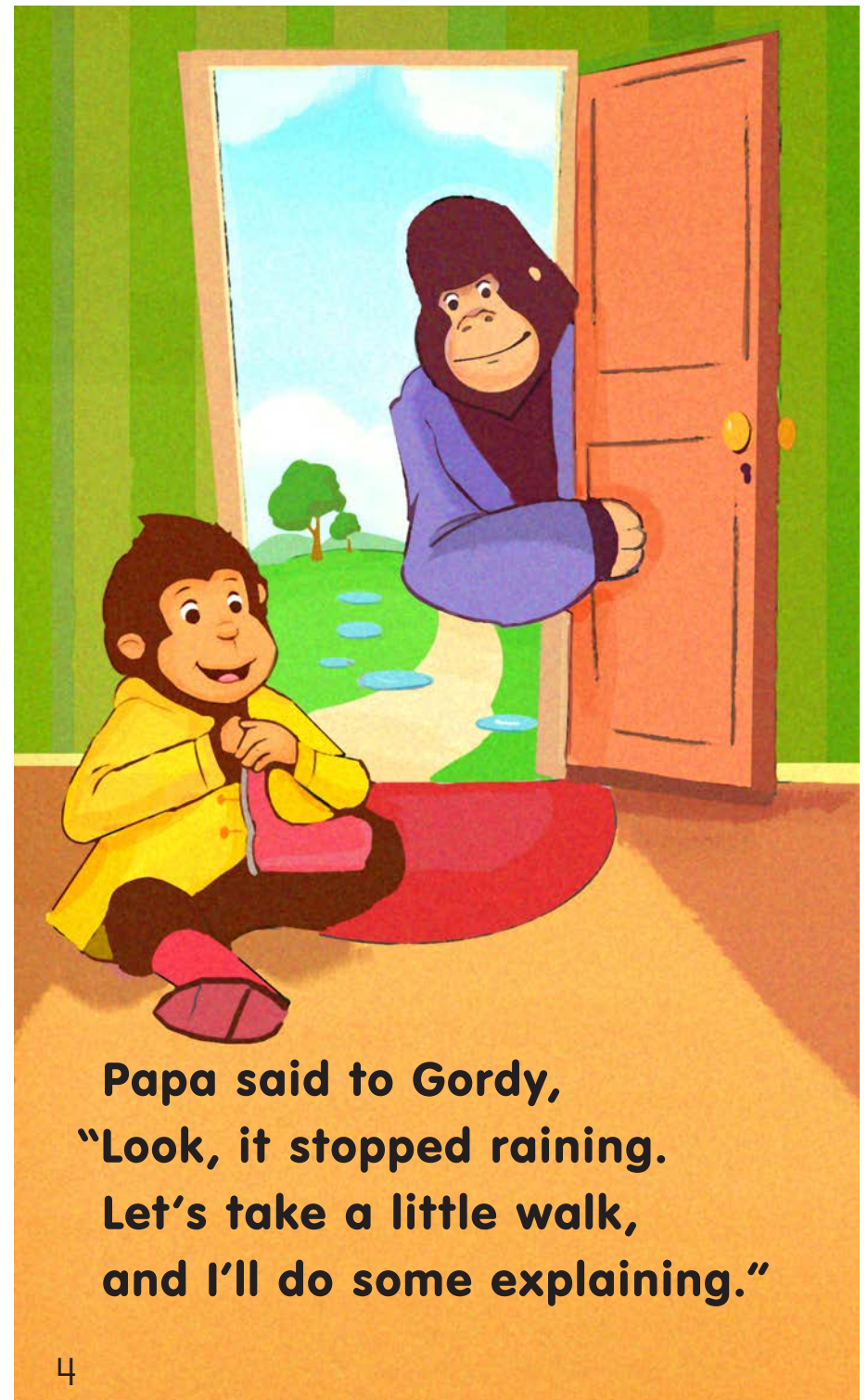

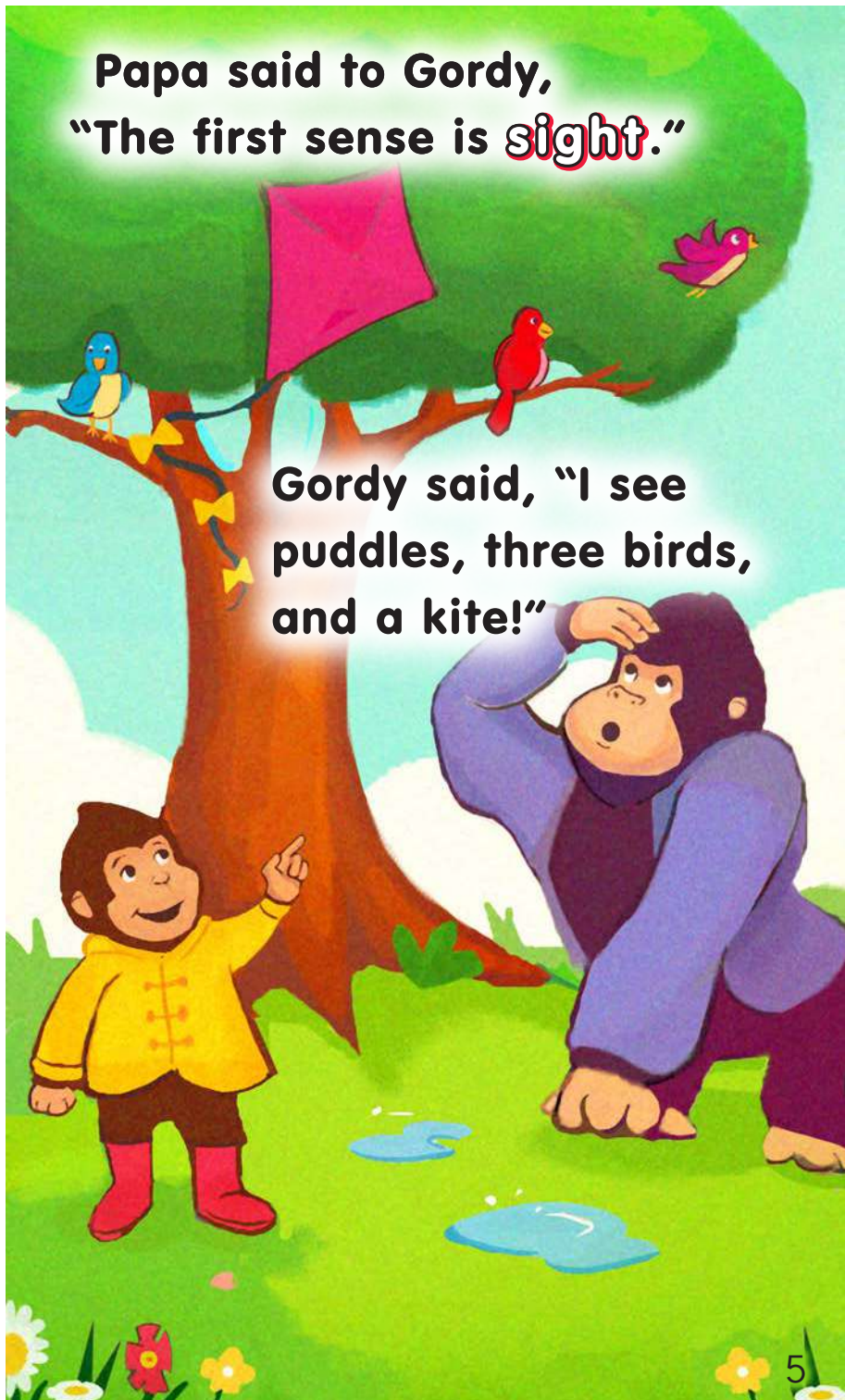
**Gordy said to Papa,

What do they do?”**



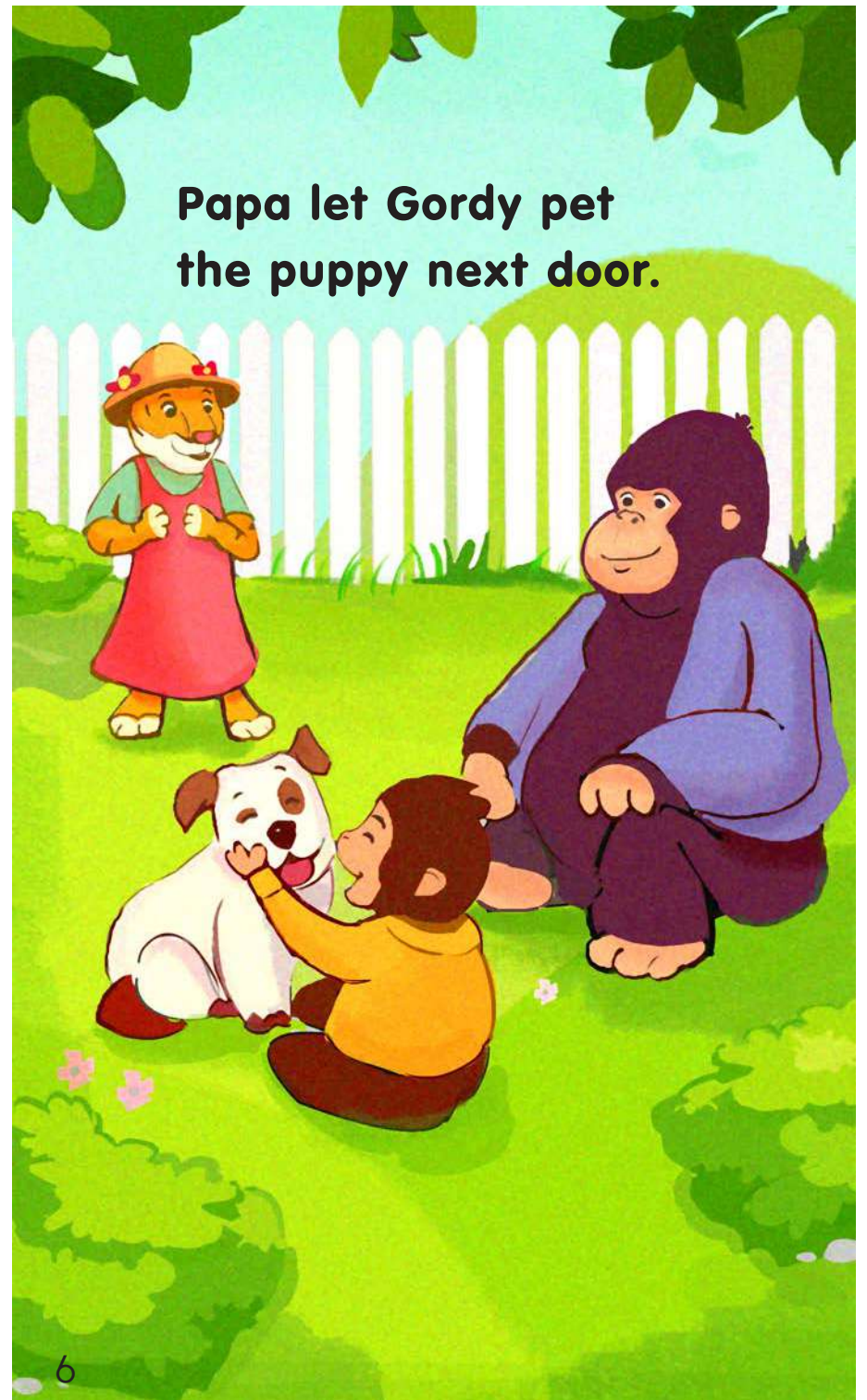
**Papa said to Gordy,

and a kite!"



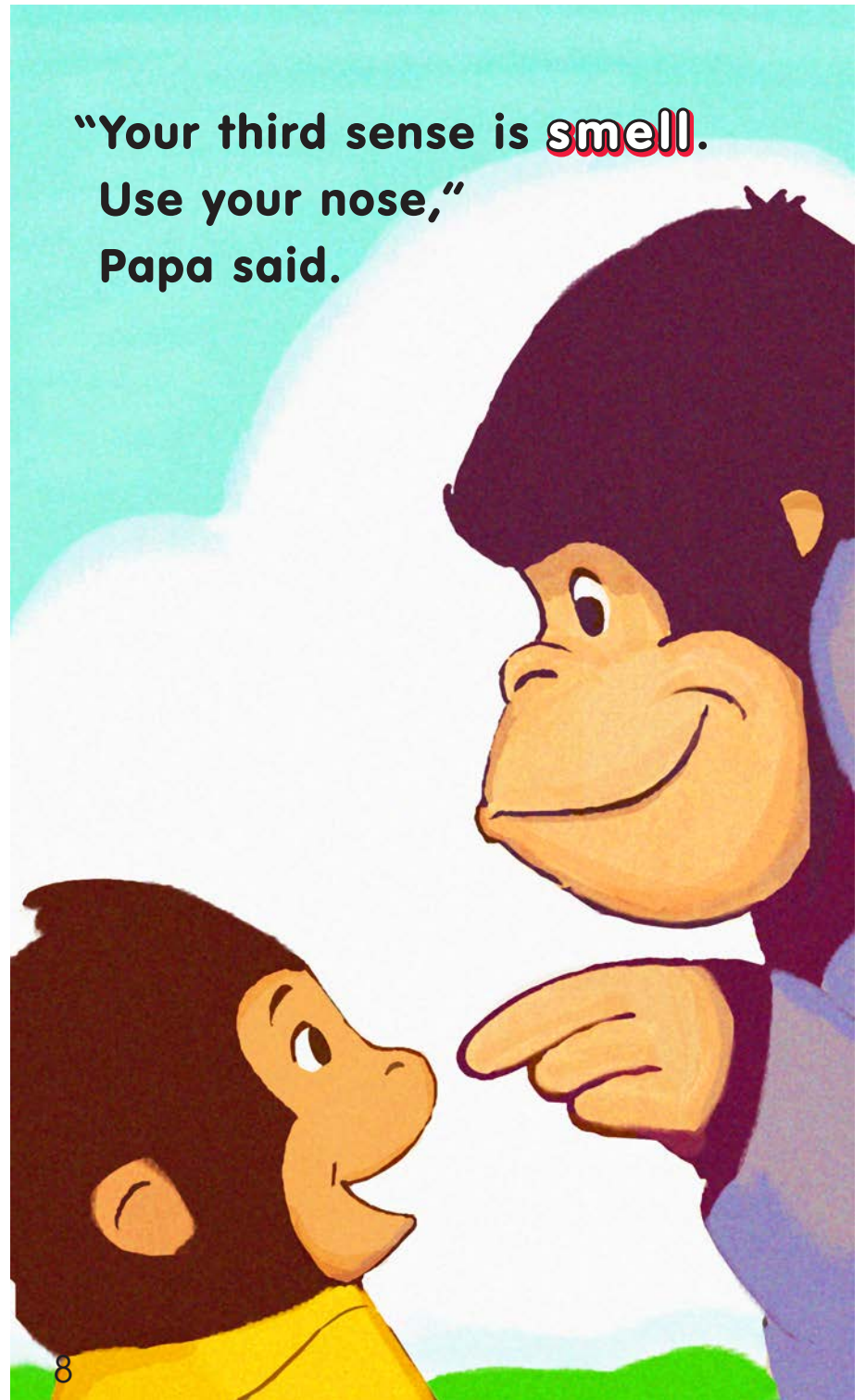
Papa let Gordy pet
the puppy next door.



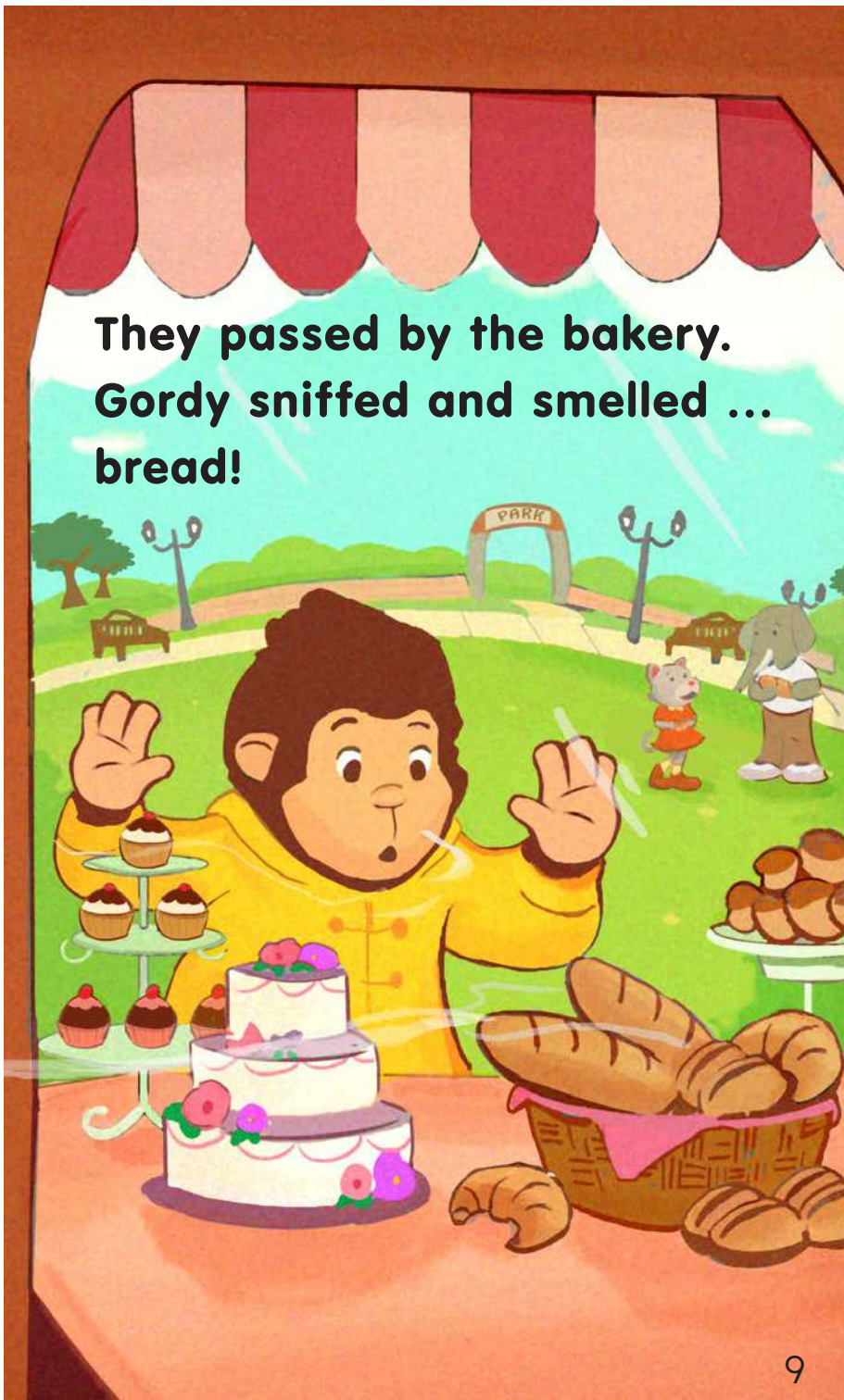
"The second sense is **touch**!"
Gordy said. "Show me more."



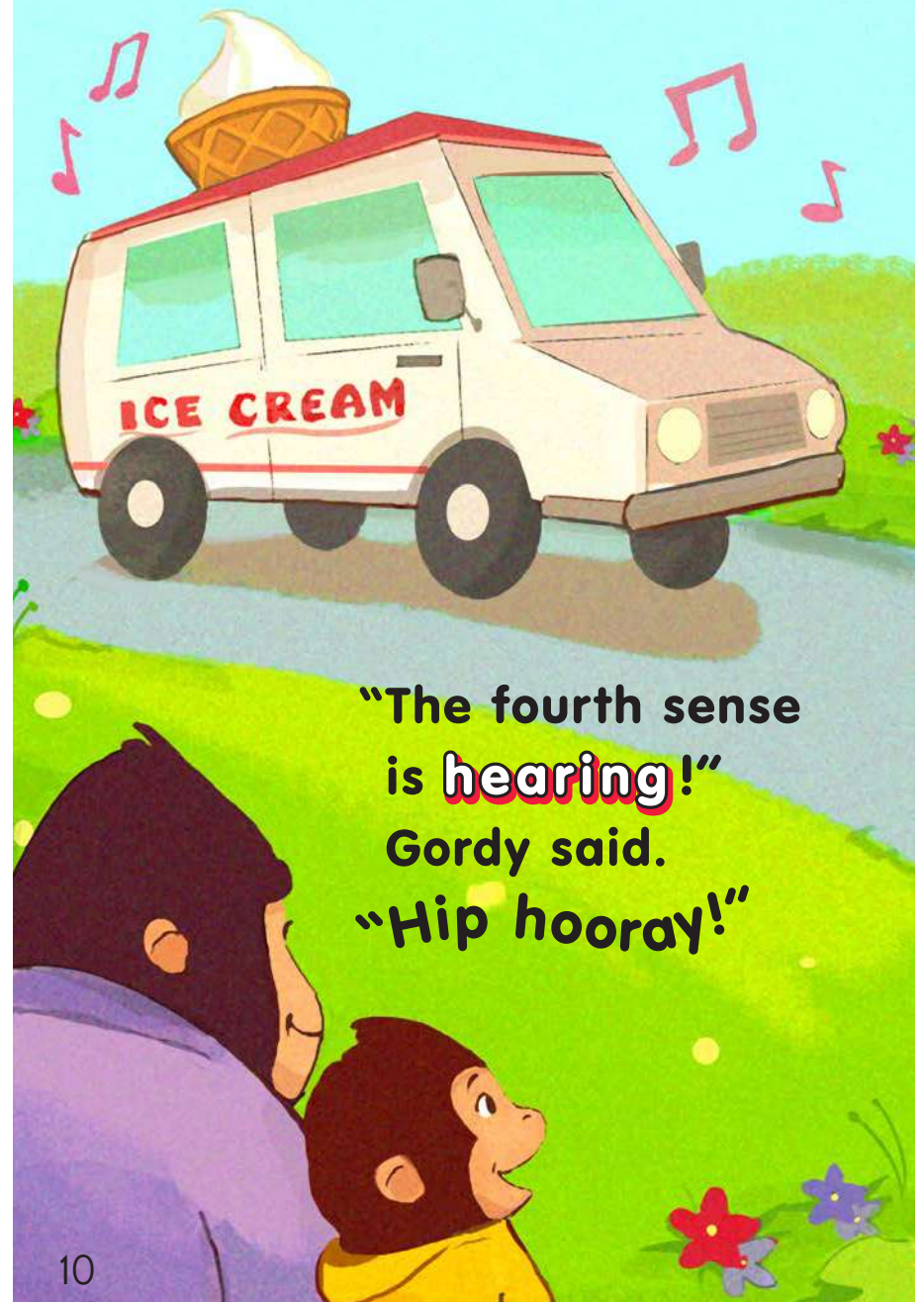
"Your third sense is **smell**.
