Half Hollow Hills CSD Course Weighting Policy

What you need to know:

- Students earn a True & Weighted Grade Point Average (GPA) on their Transcript
- The True & Weighted Average computed at the end of <u>11th grade</u> indicates the GPA sent on College Application Transcripts
- Our school utilizes a **100 grading scale**. No grade (true or weighted) ever exceeds 100.

| Courses are weighted as follows: | | |

Here is an example based on an 80 final grade in a course:

| AP Course Final Avg.= 80% | Honors Course Final Avg.=80% | Regents Course Final Avg.=80% |

| 20 is multiplied by .50 =10 10 pts. added to original 80 average | 20 is multiplied by .30 = 6; 6 pts. added to original 80 average | 100 – 80= 20; 20 is multiplied by .10 = 2; 2 pts. added to original 80 average Weighted average = 82 |

*Electives (Major Subject Enrichment Courses, Family & Consumer Science, Business (Except courses designated "College"), Art (Except AP), Health & Physical Education Courses receive NO WEIGHT in the course average.

National Honor Society

Criteria for Consideration: Open to Juniors (and above only).

Scholarship: Juniors must have earned a minimum of 11 units of credit toward a New York State high school diploma.

- ☐ A minimum 93% "National Honor Society" average (not the True or Weighted average & NOT ROUNDED UP from ex. 92.99) through the 5th semester (midpoint of Grade 11.)
- All courses count including any high school credit bearing course taken prior to entry into grade 9.

Determining "National Honor Society" Grade Point Average Eligibility:

- AP and Honors course grades are calculated differently than Regents or Elective courses.
 - AP courses will be computed using their weighted value (.5)
 - Honors courses will be computed using their weighted value (.3)
 - Regents and Elective courses earn their true average only. No weight is factored.



Character: Content of student discipline records and faculty evaluations will be scrutinized and weighed heavily by the faculty council, and may be grounds for exclusion.

DIGITAL PSAT- FALL 2023

Co-sponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC), the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT-NMSQT) is a standardized test targeting 11th graders. Every year, approximately 3.5 million students take the PSAT.



Why take the PSAT?

- Familiarize students with the test questions & format of the new Digital SAT
- "Dress rehearsal" for test
- Results can guide your test prep
- Colleges will not see your scores
- Qualify students for a National Merit Scholarship
- Colleges might try to recruit students

DIGITAL PSAT- FALL 2023



How can students practice for the digital PSAT/NSMQT?

Full-length practice tests for the PSAT/NMSQT will be available in the Bluebook™ testing application in early summer 2023.

DIGITAL SAT- BEGINS MARCH 2024

Students have 64 minutes to complete the Reading and Writing section and 70 minutes to complete the Math section for a total of 2 hours and 14 minutes.

| Component | Time Allotted (minutes) | Number of Questions/Tasks |
|-------------------|----------------------------|---------------------------|
| Reading & Writing | 64 (two 32-minute modules) | 54 |
| Math | 70 (two 35-minute modules) | 44 |
| Total | 134 | 98 |

- The first module is adaptive. Each section contains a broad mix of easy, medium, and hard questions. Based on how students perform on the first module, the second module of questions will either be more difficult or less difficult.
- Most of the questions are multiple choice, though some of the math questions ask you to enter the answer rather than select it.
- On all questions, there's no penalty for guessing: if you're not sure of the answer, it's better to guess than leave the response blank.

SAT FORMAT COMPARISON

College

CURRENT VERSION ENDS DECEMBER, 2023

- Reading: 65-minute section with 52 questions (75 seconds per question)
- Writing & Language: 35-minute section with 44 questions (about 48 seconds per question)
- Math No Calculator: 25-minute section with 20 questions (75 seconds per question)
- Math Calculator: 55-minute section with 38 questions (about 87 seconds per question)
- 3 hours of testing time

DIGITAL VERSION BEGINS MARCH, 2024

- The Digital SAT is composed of two sections: Reading and Writing & Math
- Students have 64 minutes to complete the Reading and Writing section (54 questions)
- Students have 70 minutes to complete the Math section (44 questions)
- Calculator is built into testing platform & permitted on all math questions
 - 2 hours and 14 minutes of testing time






