College-bound juniors should take the SAT tests which are held March 14, May 2, and June 6, 2015. Each time you take the SAT, and most take it 2-3 times, it will cost \$52.50. You must register online at <a href="https://www.collegeboard.com">www.collegeboard.com</a>, not through the guidance office.

ACT tests are an alternative to the SAT for college admission. The ACT measures grammar, science reasoning skills, and higher math skills. Spring ACT scores are February 7, April 18 and June 13, 2015. The cost is \$38 without the writing portion and \$54.50 with writing. Register online at <a href="https://www.actstudent.org">www.actstudent.org</a>.

Students who qualify for free or reduced lunches should see me for SAT and ACT fee waivers.

## Class of 2016 Graduation Requirements

English (4 required)
Social Studies (4 required)
Math (4 required)
Science (3 required)
Physical Education (.5 required)
Health (required)

Students must also satisfactorily complete:

- 1) graduation project
- 2) Keystone Exam proficiency or local assessment (If you did not pass the Biology or Algebra Keystone exam, you should be in remediation. See me with any concerns.)
  - 3) a minimum of 24 credits (23--2-year CTE, 22--3-year CTE)

## How Are You Doing?

At the beginning of your junior year, you should have completed the following subjects.....


2 years of English 2 years of Science 2 years of Math Gym class 2 years of Social Studies Health
