Reading and Writing with Shay

In chapter 39, Ally’s slogan for the election was, “Ally is your Ally...” The word Ally is a homonym. A homonym is two or more words with the same spellings but different meanings.

Make a list of homonyms. Choose a homonym from the list and write your own slogan. Make a poster displaying your slogan.

Creating Math with Keisha

In chapter 40, the votes from the class election are counted up. Ally gets a greater amount of votes than Shay. Listen to this song- [Greater Than, Less Than](#). Using index cards or paper, create cards with the numbers 0-9. Use these cards to create two 3-digit numbers and use the >, < or = symbols to compare the numbers. Example: 264 > 193

What can you do/say to someone who has this feeling?

Explore Science with Albert

Can you keep up with Oliver? (PE)

Play rock-paper-scissors with someone in your family. If you win, take a victory lap around the inside or outside of your house. If you lose, do a wall sit while you sing “Row, Row, Row Your Boat” during the other player’s victory lap.. (wall sit - using the wall like the back of a chair, bend legs so you look like you are sitting on a chair) Together you can come up with other exercises to do when you win or lose for a change of pace.
