Procedures		
Pre- lesson	Collect magazine images of people (bust)	
Prep		
Day 1	Using images of completed projects, encourage students to look through magazines or stack of precut images. Select image. Cut out image from magazine making sure to cut along the hairline removing any existing hair. Glue hairless portrait to bottom of white paper using glue stick. Use pencil to draw 5-7 curving, organic lines from the hairless head to the tops and sides of the paper. Using zentangle reference sheets to begin filling each hair section with a different, intricate, detailed zentangle design.	
Day 2	Continue drawing in pencil the zentangle designs until the entire "hair" is filled with pattern.	
Day 3	Trace the pencil lines in black sharpie or black pen
