TEACHER MODELING				
<ul> <li>Project your <u>Brainstorm</u> organizer. Explain that the first thing you need to do is brainstorm a topic to write about. Explain that one way to write a really good personal narrative is to think of a time in your life when you felt a strong emotion like joy, sorrow, fear, or excitement. Think aloud as you write ideas on your organizer.</li> <li>Circle two events on your organizer that you are most interested in writing about. Briefly tell your students about these two events. Invite your students to help you choose which event to write about. Star the event you plan to write about.</li> </ul>				
WRITING TIME				
<ul> <li>Distribute the <u>Brainstorm</u> organizer and ask students to use it to think of and record small moments in their lives when they felt a strong emotion like joy, sorrow, fear, or excitement.</li> <li>Ask students to circle their two favorite events that they might want to write about.</li> <li>Conference with individual students as the class brainstorms.</li> </ul>				
SHARING TIME				
<ul> <li>Pair students. Ask them to briefly share their two stories with one another. Partners can help each other select which event to write about. Ask students to star the event they will write about.</li> <li>Invite a few students to share with the class the topic they chose for their personal narrative.</li> </ul>
