

If you (the applicant) are invoicing: After receiving the ECF-supported eligible equipment and/or services, you will file the <u>ECF FCC Form 472</u>, the Billed Entity Applicant Reimbursement (BEAR)
 Form to invoice for reimbursement of the ECF-supported eligible equipment and/or services. If you request reimbursement prior to paying your service provider(s), you will be required to provide verification that you paid your service provider(s) within 30 days of receipt of funds.

If your service provider(s) is invoicing: The service provider(s) must provide the ECF-supported

FY2022: COVID-19 Summer Programming Reimbursement

Fund Code: 437

Purpose:

The purpose of this state grant is to reimburse public school districts for the costs of summer school and other summer programming (for expenses or obligations incurred April – September 2021) intended to remedy and reverse COVID-19 pandemic-related learning loss.

Priorities:

If more funding is requested than available,

- Priority will be given to reimburse costs first for any services related to mental health
- issues facing students returning to in-person after remote or hybrid learning, including efforts to
 improve student socialization skills weakened by isolation, ensuring access to social services,
 mental health, and behavioral health resources to address the potential trauma and other effects
 of the pandemic on students; and
- Priority will also be given to districts and schools in chronically underperforming status.

Eligibility:

Massachusetts public school districts, including charters and collaboratives.

Funding Type:

State

Funding:

Approximately \$15,000,000 is available through state FY2022 budget line item 7061-0027.

Applicants must request a minimum of \$10,000 and a maximum of up to \$200,000 as reimbursement for summer programming costs. Districts with any schools in chronically underperforming status or that serve high numbers of students designated economically disadvantaged (approximately 50% or more) may request to exceed maximum and Department will confirm if it can be met. Request should be aligned with size of district and scope of summer programming. Note: As these are state funds, reimbursement requests can supplant federal or state funding already awarded from flexible federal grants (except for any required set asides for summer 2021 programming) but should not supplant funding already awarded by the Department for summer 2021 through fund codes 120, 121, 530, 528, 525, 527, 644, 645, 646, 647 and 336-613.

Funding is contingent upon availability. All dollar amounts listed are estimated/approximate and are subject to change. If more is requested than available, the approved amount for each applicant may be less than the amount requested. If more funding becomes available, it will be distributed under the same guidelines that appear in this RFP document.

Fund Use:

Funds must be used in alignment with the purpose and priorities outlined and as described in a budget, budget narrative, and required program information that is submitted to the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education's (Department's) Office of Student and Family Support. **Indirect and equipment costs are not allowed.** More details provided in Part III — Required Program Information (see Required Forms section below).

Note: Assistance funded by this item shall only be available on a one-time non-recurring basis. No funds distributed from this item to a municipality or regional school district shall be considered base aid in fiscal year 2023. Any funds distributed from this item to a city, town or regional school district shall be deposited and held in a separate account and shall be expended by the school committee of such city, town or regional district without further appropriation, not withstanding any general or special law to the contrary.
