



- **Saludos y Despedidas**

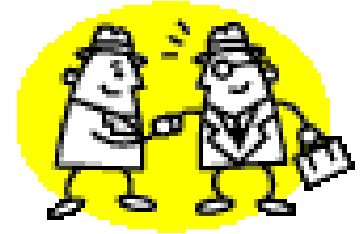


- **When greeting someone it is customary to shake hands. Many people also exchange a kiss on the cheek or a hug. The greeting changes with the time of the day.**

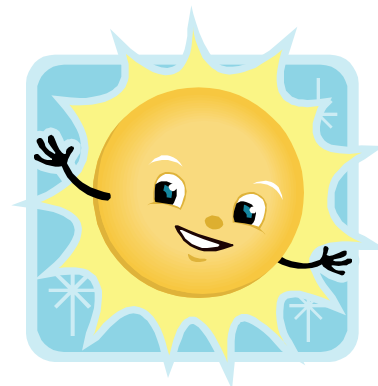


- **Hola.**

- **(oh-la)**



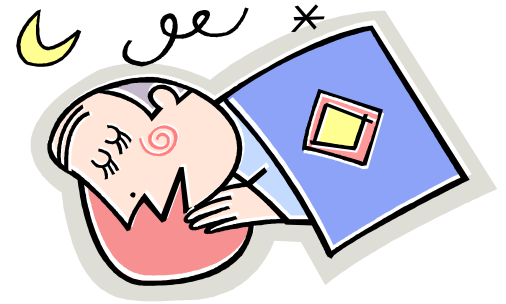
- **This expression can be used by anyone at anytime.**



- **Buenos días is used in the morning.**
- **(B-way-nos-dee-ahs)**



- **Buenas tardes is used in the afternoon and early evening.**
- **(B-way-nas-tar-days)**



- **Buenas noches is used at night.**
- **(B-way-nas-no-chays)**



- **These expressions are all used to say good-bye.**

(Despedidas=Farewells)



- Adiós
- Means Good-bye



- **Hasta mañana**
literally means
“until tomorrow”



- **Hasta luego**
- **Means: “see you later”**

Hasta
pronto

- See you soon!



- **Nos vemos**
- **(Used to express that you and another person expect to see each-other later in the day or in the near future.)**

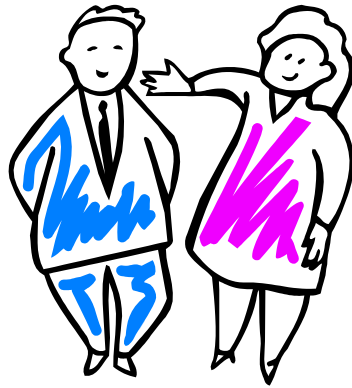


- **Introducing ourselves

- If you want to find out someone's name you can ask:

**¿Cómo te
llamas?**



- **To answer that question you say:
Me llamo _____**
- **(My name is _____)**



- **As a polite gesture, you should say: “Encantado” which is one way to say nice to meet you!**



- Boys: You have to use the form:
Encantado



- **Girls: You say
“Encantada”**



- You can also say
“es un placer”
which means “it’s
a pleasure”



- Or you can say also “Mucho gusto” which means “Nice to meet you”



- You can respond to “Nice to meet you” also by saying: “El gusto es mío.” which means: The pleasure is all mine.
