- The greatest or highest amount possible or attained. (noun) Ex: The school takes a <u>maximum</u> of 32 students.
- At the most. (adverb)

 Ex: It has a length of 4 feet <u>maximum</u>.
- As great, high, or intense as possible or permitted. Ex: The vehicles <u>maximum</u> speed.

Maximum (maksemem)

& Giving a lot of information clearly and in a few words; brief but comprehensive. (adjective)

Ex: A <u>concise</u> account of the country's history.

Concise (kansis)

The state of being extremely poor. (noun)

Ex: Thousands of families are living in abject poverty.

The state of being inferior in quality or insufficient in amount. (noun)

Ex: The <u>poverty</u> of her imagination.

Poverty (pavarde)

Hit with force when moving. (verb)

Ex: She collided with someone.

&Come into conflict. (verb)

Ex: In his work, politics and metaphysics collide.

Collide (Kolide)

& To be exceptionally good at or proficient in an activity or subject. (verb)

Ex: a sturdy youth who excelled at football.

Excel (iksel)

Ex: one unit is <u>equivalent</u> to one glass of wine.

Equivalent (ekwivelent)

Beneficial (benafishal)

&Conversation between two or more people s a feature of a book, play or movie. (noun)

Ex: The book consisted of a series of <u>dialogues</u>.

⟨ Take part in a conversation or discussion to resolve a problem.

(verb)

Ex: He stated he wasn't going to dialog with him.

Dialogue (dialog)

A Having or showing strong desire and determination to succeed. (adjective)

Ex: The football player was <u>ambitious</u> to win the championship.

Ambitious (ambituas)

Deny someone access to something or someone. (verb) Ex: all my friends excluded me from their party.

Excluded

Warm and friendly. (adjective) \
Ex: the atmosphere was <u>cordial</u> and relaxed.

Cordial (cordal)

A thing that is regarded as more important than another. (noun) Ex: Homework should be a high <u>priority</u>.

Priority (prierede)

☼Of or relating to running of a home or family relations. (adjective0 Ex: Domestic chores are chores that are done around the house.
⅙A person that is there to help with menial things. (noun)
Ex: We hired a maid to do our domestic chores.

Domestic (damestik)

Harsh and demanding. (adjective)

Ex: there is east exercises and <u>rigorous</u> excurses.
