New, redesigned SAT

The current SAT will be administered until January 2016. Then, beginning in March 2016, the SAT will change. While still assessing skills in reading, writing, and math, the redesigned SAT will focus on the knowledge and skills that current research shows are essential for college and career readiness and success.

Some important changes to the redesigned SAT will include:

- No penalty for wrong answers
- More relevant words in context rather than obscure vocabulary
- In-depth focus on essential areas of math
- An optional essay that mirrors college writing assignments

Class of 2016

Graduating seniors will most likely continue taking the current SAT only. Most college bound seniors will not take the SAT after the January administration.

Class of 2017 and beyond

While some current juniors may choose to take the current SAT in December or January, it may be more beneficial to wait until March and take the new, redesigned SAT only.
