COMMUNITY

Mount Vernon, located 45 miles northeast of Columbus, Ohio, is the largest city in Knox County and is the county seat. Agriculture is the largest industry complemented with a diverse manufacturing industry. All levels of socio-economic background are represented. The population of Mount Vernon is approximately 14,500. Kenyon College, Mount Vernon Nazarene University and Central Ohio Technical College-Knox Campus are in close proximity to the high school. Several high school students take advantage of College Credit Plus opportunities or guest student status at these neighboring institutions.

SCHOOL

Mount Vernon High Schools is a public school accredited by the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement. Approximately 35% of the juniors will choose to enter a two-year program at the Knox County Career Center. Another 5-10% of the class will enroll in a one-year program at the Knox County Career Center. Of the remaining seniors, an estimated 55% will matriculate to two year and four-year colleges. The school year is composed of two semesters (four 9-week grading periods). The school day consists of seven 46-minute academic class periods. Many students participate in extracurricular activities at school and in the community.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS The Mount Vernon Board of Education requires that students graduate with a minimum of 20 credits. All students must meet the following credits to graduate.
