- 11. Elementary Success Visible and know the children; lunch duty; Powerschool write ups regarding student behavior shared with Elementary Principal, Success, Counselor; celebrate the successes; pull out of the classroom to do one on one, provide solutions and interventions
- C. Updates from Principals Mr. Sickles & Ms. Dursky
 - Mr. Sickles MTSS process: 3 areas-Behavior, Students struggling academically, Students who are excelling academically, meet twice a month, (3) tiers are (1) high quality classroom-wide, (2) address a student's gap in skills, (3) intensive support usually provided more often and in smaller groups
 - 2. Ms. Dursky expand MTSS into the Middle School and High School; state rating is commendable, attendance is a little above average 91.7 (our data shows better results)
