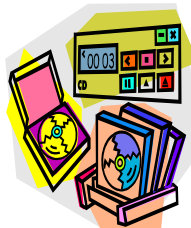

## POLICIES

**CIRCULATION~** Students must show their ID when checking out books. Books are checked out for 2 weeks unless otherwise stated. Back issues of magazines may be checked out for a period of 3 days.

**PASSES~** Students must sign in and present a gold library pass from their teacher to enter the library during regular class periods.

**LUNCHTIME/AFTER SCHOOL~** The LMC is open during all lunches except at times when two classes are working in the library at the same time. The LMC is open after school every Tuesday and Wednesday until 4:30 for Junior & Senior Projects. Ms. Sopczak will be in the library every Monday until 3:30. Students must sign in at the desk and work quietly on school related assignments during these times.

**FINES~** Overdue books are charged a fine of 5 cents per day unless it is an overnight reference book or magazine. Magazines and overnight references are charged a fine of 25 cents per day. Overdue laptops are charged a fine of 50 cents per day. Library fines must be paid and cleared before purchasing any dance tickets.

**LAPTOP CHECK OUT:** A small number of laptop computers are available for student check out for school assignments. Laptops have Microsoft Office products. They do not have internet capability. These are checked out for 1-5 days based on student need. See library staff to request a laptop.
