### CLASSROOM AND REHEARSAL EXPECTATIONS FOR ALL BAND STUDENTS

- 1. Be On Time to Class! Students should be in the band room <u>by the bell</u> and in their seat with their instrument <u>two minutes</u> after the bell rings.
- 2. Get Rid of the Gum! No food, drink, gum, or candy is allowed in the band room without the director's permission.
- 3. Bring Your Stuff! Students must bring their instruments, their music, <u>and a pencil</u> to class every day. See p. 6 for instrument specific materials.
- **4. Take Care of Your Stuff!** Students are held responsible for cleaning up after themselves and putting their equipment away at the end of every rehearsal.

#### 5. RESPECT!

- Your Teacher! Please respect your teacher by not talking during rehearsals. If you have a question, please raise your hand and wait to be recognized. Questions need to be asked from your seats, not up at the director's podium.
- Your Classmates! Show respect to your band members at all times.
- OUR Equipment! Your instrument is for you to play and only you. Instruments are extremely expensive so students should never play each other's instruments. In addition, ONLY PERCUSSIONISTS should ever play the percussion instruments in the hand room.
- 6. Turn in Written/Performance Homework! The year-long homework assignment for all Hayfield Band Students is to practice at home. Make sure you are practicing so you will receive successful grades on your performance and written assignments. Don't just practice to get it right, practice until you can't get it wrong!
- 7. Be Ready and Willing! When you walk into the band room, you should always be <u>ready</u> to work and <u>willing to learn</u>. We won't ask for perfection but will insist that you do your best every time we meet.
- 8. Have Fun! Being a part of band should be a fun experience for all students. If you try your best to meet the first 9 expectations, this last one will happen all by itself



#### Program Overview

The 5<sup>th</sup> grade band program consists of weekly lessons and full group rehearsals. Students will learn the fundamentals of playing their instrument, which will lay the groundwork for middle school and high school band. Students will be divided into small groups of like instruments for their weekly lessons. In addition to lessons, all 5<sup>th</sup> grade band students will meet once a week to play as a large group. Students will be introduced to ensemble playing and following the conductor during these weekly rehearsals. Concert music preparation will also take place during large group band. Tone production, posture, instrument care, and music literacy (rhythms/note/staff reading, listening, writing) are some of the many concepts and skills students will learn throughout the year.

Weekly small group lessons and full group rehearsals are also a part of the 6-8<sup>th</sup> grade band program. Students will meet for large group, 40-minute rehearsals on Tuesdays and Thursdays, and will receive an additional 20-minute weekly sectional on Mondays. Students are responsible for keeping track of and attending all lessons throughout the year. 6-8<sup>th</sup> grade students will learn and perform a variety of music and further develop music skills such as tone production and music literacy (rhythm/note/staff reading, listening, writing) throughout the year.



#### Class Materials

All 5-8th grade band students are expected to bring the appropriate materials to class and lessons each day. Students need:

1. Instrument along with appropriate cleaning materials

#### **Discipline**

No large organization such as band can function properly without well-disciplined participants. Considering the large class sizes in band it is imperative that all students demonstrate self-discipline and control.

#### HHS Junior High Expectations (same in all junior high classes)

1. Unless directed otherwise, all student work will be written in complete sentences (starts with a capital letter, uses punctuation, and includes at least a noun and verb in a complete thought)

Consequence- Students will receive half credit for correct answers not written in complete sentences.

- 2. Students will listen the first time information is given.

  Consequence- Teachers will repeat/rephrase information for understanding, but not for poor listening.
- 3. Students will not interrupt class discussion or instruction. Students will raise their hands and wait patiently to be called on.

  Consequence- Students will receive classroom detention to be served at the teacher's discretion.
- 4. Students will be prepared for each class by bringing a charged laptop, writing utensil, notebook, assignment, folder, agenda, and all other necessary classroom materials.

#### Absences:

Excused Absences: Personal illness and family emergencies are examples of excused absences. If an excused absence does occur, an email or phone call must be provided to Mrs. Anderson by a parent/guardian. These absences will be made up through a performance assignment. It is the student's responsibility to see the teacher for make-up work. Remember that lack of transportation is not considered an excused absence. Be sure to plan ahead.

Unexcused Absences: Unexcused absences are absences not verified by a parent or guardian. Reasons like "I had to baby sit," "I couldn't find a ride," "I had sports practice," or "I forgot" fall into the unexcused category. If a student/parent knows a band event will need to be missed, please let Mrs. Anderson know NOW.

#### **Concert Attire**

Our band concerts are formal dress and we all dress alike (just like the pros do).

<u>5-6th Grade Students:</u> Students should dress nice. Dresses, skirts, dress pants, dress shoes, button up shirts, and nice sweaters are all examples of appropriate dress. Inappropriate dress that should not be worn include jeans, tennis shoes, hats, t-shirts.

- White shirt (button down preferred-long or short sleeved)
- Black dress pants (no jeans or tight yoga pants), all black dress, or black skirt (appropriate length)
- Black socks and black shoes (no white showing on the shoes. Sandals are permitted if they are black.)



#### **Uniforms**

All Senior High Band Members will be issued a uniform to wear for concerts, contests, and select events throughout the year. The uniform has five parts: blue coat, white coat, trousers, bow tie, and black shoes

Students are responsible for providing a pair of <u>black socks</u> to wear with their uniform, and for having a clean, pressed <u>white dress shirt with collar</u> for clip-on bow tie to be worn with concert uniform.

#### Pep Band

Senior High band students will perform at various sporting events throughout the fall and winter sports seasons. Attending the pep band events is required for all senior high band students and part of students' grades. The band will perform at any post-season games a team makes it to. See the "Performance" section on p. 11 for more details.

#### Jazz Band

Jazz Band open to all 9-12<sup>th</sup> grade band students. It is an optional, extra-curricular ensemble that meets on Mondays and Wednesdays before school from 7:10-7:50am. Jazz will begin at the end of September and meet through the end of the year. This ensemble is extra-curricular and is not graded. Jazz will perform at the December 12<sup>th</sup> and May 8<sup>th</sup> concerts with the Senior High Band, as well as a joint concert with the Viking Singers on Saturday, May 6th, 2023.



#### Leadership Team

The leadership team is open to all 9-12<sup>th</sup> grade students interested in being a role model and leading their peers throughout the year. This can be done in a variety of ways, from organizing music and uniforms, to leading sectionals, pep band or warm-ups. The leadership team will meet twice a month for training and planning.

#### **Band Awards**

There are many opportunities to receive special music awards throughout the year.

Band Letter – Band is a co-curricular activity. Not only do you receive an academic grade, but you also receive the benefits of an extra-curricular organization. The grade reflects what you do in class, but hours spent outside of the classroom are awarded with a Band Letter award. To earn a band letter, students must

- 1. Earn an "A" in band for all four quarters
- 2. Be a member of Senior High Band for the full academic year
- 3. Perform the National Anthem as a soloist or in a small group (separate from the pep band) at a home sporting event
- 4. No unexcused absences from band performances, contests, or pep band events
- 5. Do at least <u>TWO</u> of the following:
  - a. Perform and earn an "Excellent" or "Superior" rating at Solo/Ensemble
  - b. Participate in Jazz Band for the entire academic year
  - c. Participate in or audition for an honor band
  - d. Be on the Leadership Team for the entire academic year.
  - e. Performing your instrument or attending musical performances in the community (must be approved by Mrs. Anderson)
  - f. Complete a service project that you believe will enhance the band program at Hayfield (must be approved by Mrs. Anderson)
  - g. Band Student Aide for one semester

#### Small -Group Contest Medals and Certificates

Students who participate in small group contest and receive an excellent or superior rating will be awarded with a certificate and/or medal.

#### **Band Awards**

<u>Most Improved Player</u>: students vote for the band member they feel improved the most over the course of the school year.

<u>Most Valuable Player:</u> students vote for the band member they feel demonstrated outstanding leadership, dedication, and musical excellence throughout the year.

<u>Rookie of the Year:</u> Awarded to a freshman or first year instrumentalist who has made a significant contribution to the band.
