Girl's Cross Country Win Div. II U.P. State Finals

The girls' Cross Country team ended their season with a big win at the championship U.P. Finals in Marquette. This team beat seven other schools in Division II, and their closest rival, St. Ignace, by almost 20 points. U.P. Champion Maylie Kilpela was first overall in the race with a time of 21:16, a time which would have also won the Division III race and also would have given her a top ten finish in Division I.

Sierrah Driscoll and Makenna Nuttall came out 5th and 6th overall, and Jacie Anderson finished 9th. Those four girls received All-State Honors. Adia Keranen, Cayley Cunard and Kysa Keranen rounded out the championship team, all competing very well and with their finishes and times making it possible to get the victory. Cassi Pietila did not compete in finals because a team cannot be more than seven runners. But she ran varsity for much of the season, making it possible for this team to never place lower than 3rd in any invitational.

These girls have beaten Houghton, Chassell and Westwood, all excellent teams, over the course of the season. Jacie, Makenna, Cayley and Adia were the core of the team, running every practice and race, while Sierrah, Maylie, Kysa and Cassi found time along with their volleyball schedule to practice and race whenever they could. Both groups deserve high praise for their hard work and dedication. Congratulations on the big win.
