High School Graduation Requirements

Information: For students entering 9th grade before 2009, students need 25 credits to graduate. For students entering high school in 2009 or later, students need 24 credits to graduate.

College Admission Standards for Graduating Classes Beginning with 2009

Required courses for students who anticipate attending a *West Virginia State* 4-year college or university are:

Foreign language – 2 credits of the same language Math – 4 total credits, three being Algebra I,
Algebra II, and Geometry English – 4 total credits Social Studies – 3 total credits including US
History
Science – 3 total credits of college prep lab courses, preferably biology, chemistry and physics Fine Arts – 1 credit

College entrance requirements vary with individual *private* schools. Students should check with specific colleges regarding their requirements.
