Academic Schedule

The school operates on a five period schedule. Each period is 68 minutes long. The year is divided into three twelve-week terms. Each course earns one credit per term. Two trimesters is equal to one year of content.

The STMA HS Music Program serves over 500 students and offers 15 performing ensembles. Recent performance highlights include collaborations with collegiate and professional ensembles and invitational performances with American Public Media, the American Choral Directors Association and the Minnesota Music Educators Association. STMA graduates are regularly awarded college financial assistance with scholarships.

Other Program Options PSEO

Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) is a program that allows juniors and seniors in Minnesota high schools access to college courses. Credits earned at the post-secondary institution are counted both on high school and college transcripts and can fulfill secondary as well as post-secondary graduation or degree requirements.

STMA Online

STMA Online gives students additional access to online coursework to meet their unique academic needs. Courses are taught by STMAstaff who use familiar technology tools to deliver curriculum. Wright Tech

Juniors and seniors may take courses through the Wright Technical Center (WTC) vocational program. Students may also enroll in technical courses offered at the high school.

On The Job Training (OJT)
