Neptune High School is a comprehensive public school accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the New Jersey Department of Secondary Education.

SCHEDULING

Block scheduling is fully implemented in Neptune High School, with courses being taught on a semester basis. A typical student schedule consists of four courses in the fall semester and four courses in the spring semester.

CURRICULUM

Neptune High School offers a fully diversified curriculum of content areas including art, business, communications, engineering, mathematics, music, physical education, NJROTC, science, social studies, world language, and vocational and technical fields. The latter is provided via a cooperative shared-time program with the Monmouth County Vocational-Technical Schools. NHS is also a host teaching site for the Monmouth County Performing Arts High School.

HONORS PROGRAM

The purpose of the Honors Program is to provide students with an accelerated and expanded approach to the curriculum in the disciplines of English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and World Languages.

JUMPSTART PROGRAMS

The Neptune High School JumpStart Programs provide students with an opportunity to explore academic and career options while enrolled in traditional high school classes. NHS offers programs in the areas of Communications, Education, Engineering, Environmental Science, NJROTC, Law & Criminal Justice, Medical Science and Performing Arts.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

2017 AP TESTING SCORES

105 AP exams were taken this year. Enrollment is expected to increase as the AP program course offerings continue to expand.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Qualified seniors are invited to participate in the Dual Enrollment program at Brookdale Community College. Eligible students may take up to 3 college credits during senior year. The goal is to allow students to experience the academic rigor of college level courses while still in high school.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

In addition to meeting state graduation assessment requirements, graduates for the Class of 2018 must accrue a minimum of 120 credits including the following: 20 credits of English, 15 credits of Mathematics, 15 credits of Lab Science, 5 credits of World History, 10 credits of U.S. History, 5 credits of Fine or Performing Arts, 5 credits of Practical Art, 5 credits of World Language, Health and PE for each year of attendance.

GRADING SYSTEM

Students are graded on a numerical scale, 65% is the minimum score allowed to earn a passing grade. Additional quality points are assigned to courses as follows:
AP +15, Honors +10, College Prep +5.

CLASS RANK

Class rank is completed after the completion of six semesters. It is determined by the Total Quality Points divided by the Total Credits Attempted.
