## **Honors English II Summer Assignments**

<u>**Directions:**</u> Choose <u>**one**</u> of the topics below and scroll down to complete both assignments associated with that topic.

## A. Injustice

- a. "Injustice" is defined as the absence of justice or the violation of the rights of another.
- b. The sense of injustice is a universal human feature, though the exact circumstances considered unjust can vary from culture to culture.

## B. "Otherness"

- a. Otherness is the state or fact of being distinct or different; stereotypes are generalizations about a group of individuals.
- b. Stereotypes divide groups of people because they see each other as "the other."

## C. Identity

- a. The choices that individuals make impact themselves, those around them, and events in their lives.
- b. Identity is shaped by what individuals are born into (such as family, race, class, culture, gender, environment, community) and by the choices that they make.

## D. Gender

a. What is considered "masculine" and what is considered "feminine" is not universal, but there are cultural "norms" for what is considered "masculine" and "feminine," norms which are reflected in a variety of media.

## E. "American Dream"

- a. The American experience is shaped by an individual's background, ethnicity, beliefs, and personal happenings.
- b. Despite the American experience being unique to individuals, there are commonalities that we all share as Americans.
