Attendance



Students who are absent: Bring in a note signed by a parent or legal guardian stating the reason for the absence(s), the date(s) of the absence and any other documentation (Dr. note/dentist note, etc.)

Turn in the note to the Main Office when you return to school. All absences are considered unexcused until a note is presented. 3 or more consecutive unexcused absences will result in a follow up from our school attendance secretary as required by NC Attendance Laws.

Late Arrival and Early Dismissal: A student who misses more than half of any block will be considered absent from that class for that day. All students arriving late to campus need to check in at the main office and any student leaving early needs to be checked out from the main office.

Attendance: Both excused and unexcused absences count towards the 10 day limit. There is a direct correlation between regular attendance and school achievement; therefore, it is imperative that students are in class every day. The North Carolina Attendance Laws (GS-115C-378) expect every student to be in attendance each school day.

Cell Phone Policy

Overview: Cell phones, smart watches, earbuds, digital cameras and similar electronic devices and all functions within the devices (i.e. cameras and all other applications) are prohibited in the following areas during the instructional day (7:15 AM-2:15 PM): Classrooms, Restrooms, all Physical Education Areas and all School Office Areas. These devices are permitted at lunch and during class transitions.

*It should be noted that refusal to surrender a cell phone or other electronic device when directed to do so by a school staff member, teacher or administrator is a violation of our school's Code of Conduct (Insubordination, disrespect, technology violation). Insubordinate behavior is punishable by suspension, exclusion from school events, inclusive of after school events, and graduation.

Parents/Guardians Responsibilities:

Please do not contact your child via their cell phone during instructional blocks. If an urgent message needs to be delivered to their child during instructional time. Hopewell's main office phone number is 980-343-5988. The staff of Hopewell High School requests your FULL cooperation with our policy. We know this policy is a change, but it is a change that is much needed for our students' well-being and their education so that they can focus on school.

If you need to discuss an issue with a cell phone policy violation, please leave a message for an administrator to follow up with you, which will be done outside of instructional time.


