#### **Classroom Procedures and Work:**

# **Purpose:**

The purpose of this course is to provide grade 7<sup>th</sup> grade students opportunities to explore and learn, representations of relationships in real-world and mathematical situations, investigating the number system, writing and applying mathematical properties, applying concepts of ratios and rates, applying knowledge of polygons, and interpreting data for college and career preparation and readiness. The content will include, but not be limited to, the following:

- active reading of varied texts for what they say explicitly, as well as for the logical inferences that can be drawn,
- evaluate numerical expressions and word problems from varied math skill plans,
- · writing for mathematical purposes,
- effective problem-solving strategies, and
- collaboration amongst peers

#### **Class Expectations:**

# **Classroom Agreements (Rules):**

In Mrs. Huggins's class every student will have an equal opportunity to become successful academically. To ensure the classroom is conducive to learning through virtual and face to face instruction, we will establish the **C.H.A.M.P.S** concept:

**C**– Conversation: Listen attentively and only use appropriate language

**H**– Help: Raise your hand and wait to speak.

A- Activity: Always follow directions the first time.

M- Movement: Always keep hands and feet to yourself.

P- Participation: Actively listening and raising hand to speak

**S**– Signal: Our signal to quiet down and give your attention is the "High Five" hand raised.
