### DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION

Hunter Huss High School is a public high school located in an urban, historical neighborhood in Gastonia, NC. Hunter Huss is part of Gaston County Schools (GCS), the ninth largest school system in the state. GCS has 32,000 students from Pre-K to 12th grade. Eleven high schools serve over 10,000 students. Hunter Huss houses a diverse group of students (58% minority and 80% economically disadvantaged).

### SCHOOL INFORMATION

Our schedule converted in the 2014-2015 school year from a four period block schedule to a seven period year long schedule. Students graduating in 2016 will have the opportunity to earn up to 30 credits. Our students have additional credit opportunities through the North Carolina Virtual Public School, Career and College program and Gaston County Choral Ensemble. Students are also eligible to take courses not offered at their home high schools with administration approval.

### GRADE POINT AVERAGE

An unweighted and weighted GPA are provided on the transcript. Honors level courses add one quality point. AP/IB courses add two quality points. Class rank is determined by the weighted GPA.

### **IBMYP INFORMATION**

Beginning 2010-2011, open access to the IBMYP curriculum requires all members of the Class of 2016 to earn the IBMYP Certificate. All members of the Class of 2016 have the opportunity to pursue the IBMYP certificate.

IBMYP curriculum requirements include: Language A (English), Language B (Spanish), Humanities, Science, Mathematics, Physical Education, Technology and Arts. To earn the certificate, students present their Personal Project and complete 15 hours of community service in grade nine.

### **IBDP INFORMATION**

The Class of 2010 was the first class eligible for the IB diploma . Two students sought the diploma and 4 students sought subject area certificates. The Class of 2012 had 12 students seeking the IB diploma and 20 seeking certificates. One criterion of earning the IB diploma is the completion of 150 Creativity, Action and Service hours. The class of 2015 had three students earn the IB diploma and 34 students earned 81 subject area certificates.
