We have an excellent staff at Indian Creek and we feel that students will benefit from any teacher's instruction, but we do recognize that finding the right fit of teaching and learning styles is important for a whole year of learning. The teachers and I consider many different factors when compiling class lists including:

- Balance by gender

- Positive or negative relationships among individual students

- Learning style needs

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### Indian Creek News



It is no secret that when us adults were growing up, the school office or principal's office was a place we didn't want to end up – a place for discipline, strict conversations, and a place our parents considered as "bad". Over the last several years, Indian Creek has worked really hard to change that image for students and parents. At Indian Creek, students are taught from the first week of school, that the office is a neutral place to go for various reasons:

- -talk with an adult about their feelings
- -reset so they can return back to class ready to learn
- -a quiet workspace
- -a quiet place to rest, when needed
- and many more

There are often times students arrive to the office overwhelmed or worried, thinking their parents are going to be bad at them for being "sent" here. We like to look at spending time in the office as more of a positive resource or a tool. Yes, there are times we talk through mistakes or school expectations, but more so, students come to reset and get back on track for learning.

Here at Indian Creek, we believe in students advocating for themselves when they feel they are not at their best and need a reset. Students have several different options with this- a stars break (locating hidden stars in the hallways), suitcase break (moving around weighted suitcases through the hallway- a grounding exercise) or coming to the office to check in with an adult.

How this works is:

- 1. Students ask their teacher for the reset break card
- 2. Students walk down to the office and check in with either Mrs. Strauser or Mrs. Harder. There they receive
- a 2-3 minute timer for their choice in break.
- 3. Students do their break and when the timer goes off, they stop and return to the office where they exchange their timer for their break card
- 4. Students head back to class- refocused for learning

When sitting around the dinner table or after reading a book at night, check in with your kiddo and ask them to explain our reset system! This will help normalize the office space as a positive place and ensures students and parents are on the same page!

### **Recess Expectations:**

As the arrival of warmer weather draws near, it's important to revisit our PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) expectations for outdoor recess with all students. Our students and staff have been reviewing these expectations to ensure that everyone demonstrates respect, responsibility, and readiness during each recess. Students have been revisiting the specific rules for different areas such as the blacktop, play space, and lining up. We need to refocus on using equipment properly, following game rules, taking turns, including all, and playing fair. Following these rules is essential for the safety and enjoyment of all, allowing everyone to have the best time with their peers.

During the month of February, students had the opportunity to vote for their school-wide celebration when they earned a Thank You Note. They could vote for School-Wide Bingo or School-Wide Dance Party. The winner, by a landslide, was school-wide dance party. The voting jar was exploding with Thank You Notes! Right before Spring Break, we were able to see everyone's best dance moves throughout the building and in the hallways.
