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### From the Principal....

March, 2017

Dear Indian Creek Families,

The teaching staff at Indian Creek Elementary School is learning about the research of John Hattie from his book entitled <u>Visible Learning For Teachers, Maximizing Impact</u> <u>on Learning</u>. We have learned about teaching practices that have the highest effect on student learning as well as the practices that have a negative effect on student learning. Along with this learning about effective teaching practices, we have also learned about some important characteristics of visible learners. See the poster at the side of this page. The characteristics of visible learners need to be explicitly taught to our students.

A visible learner is a student who:

- can be their own teacher
- can articulate what they are learning and why
- $\bullet$  can talk about how they are learning the strategies they are using to learn
- can articulate their next learning steps
- can use self-regulation strategies
- is assessment-capable (understands the assessment tools being used and what their results mean and can self-assess)
- seeks, is resilient and aspires to challenge
- can set mastery goals
- asks questions
- sees errors as opportunities and is comfortable saying that they don't know and/or need help
- positively supports their peers' learning
- . knows what to do when they don't know what to do
- actively seeks feedback

• has metacognitive skills and can talk about these (systematic planning, memory, abstract thinking, critical thinking, problem solving, etc.)

#### **State Requirements**

State guidelines require that schools inform parents about their child's reading performance at least twice a year. We meet this requirement by providing parents with information about your child's reading level, reading fluency, reading accuracy and reading comprehension. You will receive this information during your parent teacher conference. State guidelines also require that at least once per year teachers obtain a signature showing that parents have been informed of their child's reading performance at school. We meet this requirement by providing parents with their child's reading information mentioned above. Once this information has been discussed with parents, parents will be asked to sign their child's report card to show that they have been informed about their child's reading performance.

# School Bus Safety Tips

School bus safety is a shared responsibility among parents, students, and the bus driver. Please review and reinforce these bus safety guidelines with your children regularly. When we all remember and follow these rules, riding the school bus can be a safe and pleasant experience.

Safety Tips for Students:

- Avoid loose fitting clothes and clothes with long strings. This type of clothing is more likely to get caught on the door while entering or exiting the bus.
- Pack all school items in your backpack or book bag so you won't drop them when you get on or off the bus.
- Leave home early so you can arrive at the stop 5-10 minutes before your assigned stop time.
- Never run to catch the bus. If you miss the bus, go home or contact a parent/guardian.
- Walk on the sidewalk if possible. If not, walk single file on the left side of the road and stay close to the edge of the road.
- If you must cross a street, stop, look left, right and left again before crossing the street.
- When possible, parents should go to the bus stop with a young child. Older children should walk in groups.

• Buses are sometimes delayed by weather, traffic, breakdowns, etc. IF your bus is delayed, please know that your bus WILL still be coming. It may be a good idea to arrange a neighborhood watch during the winter months. This way if there happens to be an issue with the bus and it is delayed children will know what to do or where to go while waiting for the bus to arrive.





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# **After School Changes**

Our first priority is to make sure your child reaches the proper destination after school. <u>A written note sent in the morning with your child is best</u>. If you do need to make an unexpected change, during the school day, in the way your child typically goes home in the afternoon, please call the office as soon as possible and <u>no later than 2:00 pm</u>, if there is an emergency, please keep calling until you are able to speak with someone directly. Please do not call or e-mail the classroom teacher. We have seen an increase in e-mails sent as a way to notify the office and or teacher of an afternoon change. **E-mails are discouraged**, as we cannot guarantee that someone will be checking their e-mail in time to see your message. Pink notes are not intended to be a daily communication. Thank you so much for your understanding and cooperation.
