Registration for 2019-2020

eRegistration on PowerSchool will open August 5.

Please complete your eRegistration by August 19.

All families will need to log on to Power School and complete an eRegistration for each student at Indian Creek. You will need your Power School username and password to log on (just a reminder the username and password were created by you when you set up your Power School account.) Be sure to go through each screen, making any changes that need to be made and click submit at the bottom of the page (this will save all changes). If you do not need to make changes you will still need to click through the screens on Power School and click submit at the bottom of each screen. Be sure to complete the permissions at the end of the eRegistration as these need to be updated every year. Also, just a reminder, the "Use of Student Photographs, Videos, and Likenesses", "Student Internet Access", and "Student Online Accounts" have changed as of July 1, 2015 and now require a letter to be written to their building principal no later than September 15th (or within two weeks of student enrollment if enrollment occurs after this date) if parents/guardians have objections to these three permissions.

You may also pay school fees and deposit money into your family lunch account at this time \sim all online. We encourage you to complete all of your 2019–20 registration online.

For those who are **not** able to complete their eRegistration online, a walk in registration will be held on August 13th during regular office hours (7:30-3:30). The walk in registration will simply consist of completing your eRegistration on a school computer, if needed, and paying your fees in person. If you have completed your eRegistration and have paid your fees online you do *not* need to come to the walk in registration.



Morning Drop Off Procedure:

Enter the back parking lot off of 29th Avenue. Pull into lane 5, next to the sidewalk, and as far forward as possible. If you are the first vehicle you will park just beyond the corner of the gym. Students will exit the vehicle on the passenger's side of the vehicle. Drivers: please <u>REMAIN</u> in your vehicle. If Lane 5 is full pull behind the vehicles in the lane forming a U shape (see the arrows above) holding pattern. Lane 5 will fill as vehicles exit the lane. All vehicles need to <u>stay</u> in the line (do not pull out and around the vehicles in front of you) following the vehicle in front of them to the end of the lane where vehicles will turn left, staying along the edge of the parking lot back to the 29th Avenue driveway.

Afternoon Pick Up Procedure:

Notice we have five lanes designated for pick up lanes. Lane 1 and 2 are in between the first and second row of the parked cars and lanes 3, 4 and 5 are located between the parking lot and the sidewalk next to the school. Enter the back parking lot off of 29th Avenue filling lanes 1 and 2 first, then lanes 3 and 4. Lane 5 is reserved for the daycare busses and vans. The first vehicle should pull up as far as possible in the lane. If the lanes are full vehicles should form a U shape (see the arrows above) holding pattern and wait for instructions to be given by the staff on duty. Indian Creek staff will use walkie-talkies to communicate. Staff will identify drivers and call for students. Students will walk down the passenger side of each lane to load vehicles and follow instructions given by the staff on duty. *Drivers: Please REMAIN in your vehicles.* If your student has not been loaded and the lane is ready to exit please pull forward and park on the re-load area (located on the north end) of the lot. A staff member will escort your student to your vehicle.

Thank you to all of our families for following these procedures and keeping our students, staff, and families safe during these very busy times of the day.

A Few Reminders For Our Visitors

We require that <u>ALL</u> of our Indian Creek visitors sign in at the office and obtain a visitors badge which needs be worn the entire time you are visiting Indian Creek. When leaving the building, make sure to stop in the office to sign out. Please note that this is a safety policy of the Linn-Mar District and is meant for everyone visiting Indian Creek during the school day whether or not you are staying just a few minutes, staying a long time, or you are a frequent visitor/volunteer.

Volunteering:

We ask when you are volunteering at Indian Creek to please check in at the office, obtain a visitors badge, and record your volunteer hours on the volunteer computer. The district does host a 100-Hour Volunteer Recognition each year for those volunteers who reach 100 or more hours during the school year.

👺 Visiting For Lunch:

If you will be joining your child for lunch, please be sure to phone Mrs. Strauser (447-3272) by 9:00 AM to order your lunch the day you plan on coming. We do ask that you check in at the office when you arrive to sign in, obtain a visitors badge, pay for your meal, if needed, or you may have the amount deducted directly from your child's lunch account, then you may either wait in the office or on the bench located directly outside of the office for your child to come from their classroom to the cafeteria. Please note that the office does **NOT** keep cash on hand so if you plan to pay in cash please have exact change.

Miscellaneous Reminders:

- 1. If you child has forgotten something from home, you may leave it in the office and we will make sure your child receives the item. We do ask, to not add distractions to learning, that you do not go to the classroom yourself to deliver the item.
- 2. All visitors should have made arrangements with the teacher prior to arriving at school for a visit.
- 3. When visiting please be respectful and remember that school is in session from 8:00 AM to 2:45 PM.
- 4. Younger siblings should not visit the classroom with you unless approved by the teacher in advance.
- 5. Visitors should not bring gifts (balloons, flowers, etc.) to students at school.
- 6. Animals are not allowed in the building; unless approved by the teacher in advance.



Breakfast begins at 7:35. Students who arrive to school by bus or car should go directly to the multi-purpose room for breakfast. Students just need to let the supervisor on duty know that they are going to breakfast, they are not to wait in line with the other students for the 7:45 bell to ring. Students walking to school should plan to arrive at the crosswalk at 7:35 to be in the first group crossed, this will give them plenty of time to cross, eat breakfast, and make it to class by 8:00 AM. Students arriving after 7:48 AM will be offered an alternate version of breakfast, which will be quick to eat so they are on time for class beginning promptly at 8:00 AM.

Payment Options

1. Cash or checks may be sent to school daily.

- 2. On-line credits may be entered at https://intouch.linnmar.k12.ia.us/. Follow the prompts to access your account.
- 3. Credit and debit cards are accepted online. Deposits must be completed by 8:00 a.m. in order for funds to be available for same day purchases. There is **no fee** for this service.

Meal Account Balances

Meal account balances from the 2018-19 school year have automatically rolled to the building where your student will attend for the 2019-20 school year.

Free and Reduced Meal Eligibility

If your family is eligible for free school meals based on **food stamp eligibility**, you do not have to complete a new application for the 2019-20 school year. If you qualify for free or reduced meals based on your **income**, we will need a new application completed in August. Forms will be mailed to households this summer. Please return your form on registration day. Sometimes families are surprised to see the upper limits of eligibility. Please take time to read through the information you receive. Reduced price meals are \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch. This can be a BIG savings for families. All meal choices are available to all students regardless of their status. Information regarding meal status is confidential and is not "identifiable" at the cashier station. Please contact the Nutrition Services office at 447-3302 if you have questions.

Joining Your Child for Lunch.....

Would you like to join us for lunch? Simply call Mrs. Strauser at 447-3272 before 9:00am the morning you are planning to come to lunch and order a school lunch (our lunches are made off site and we need to place our order by 9:00 AM to ensure we have enough food for everyone). Sign in at the office and fill out a VISITOR badge before joining your child for lunch.

When coming for lunch, we do ask that you either eat a school lunch or bring a sack lunch from home. We request you do not buy lunch at a fast food restaurant such as McDonald's, Culver's, or Burger King to bring to school. Pop/soda are not allowed at school.

Adult lunches may be scanned from your child's lunch account or paid for in the main office. If you choose to pay with cash you will need to have the exact change. Thanks so much for your help. We hope to see you at lunch!



Indian Creek is a Blue Zone School!

What is Blue Zone?

Blue Zone began as a National Geographic expedition to find the longest living cultures and has evolved into a recipe for living longer that is now popping up as Blue Zone Projects across the country.

Blue Zone Projects are a community well-being improvement initiative designed to make healthy choices easier through permanent changes to environment, policy, and social networks.

In keeping with the Blue Zone Project here at Indian Creek we are making healthier choices too. Our lunch program has already made healthier choices for our students. We are also asking snack/birthday treats are in line with Blue Zone guidelines. Listed below are a few suggestions for snacks. Thank you for your cooperation in making Indian Creek a Blue Zone School!

Healthy Snack Options

Other guidelines to go by...

- All items must be trans-fat-free
- Snack items must be 200 calories or less per portion as packaged
- Calories from saturated fat must be less than 10% per serving
- Sodium must be limited to less than 230 mg per portion as packaged and less than 480 mg per entrée
- Items should contain no more than 35% of calories from total sugars per portion as packaged
- Products with cereal grains must contain at least 2 grams of fiber per package



The staff at Linn-Mar Community schools has committed to promoting the health and well-being of our students. In accordance with Linn-Mar's Designation as a Blue Zone School District, new procedures have been implemented to provide students with healthier lifestyle choices in regards to

birthday celebrations in the classrooms. Student birthdays may be celebrated at school. However, students will be encouraged to no longer bring food or beverages to share with classmates. Instead, birthdays can be celebrated with non-food options including (but not limited to) name recognition on the school announcements, a special acknowledgement from the school office and classroom recognitions (ie birthday crowns, sit with a special friend at lunch, being designated as the line leader for the day, ect.) Students may also choose to bring in non-food items to share with classmates and school staff such as pencils, special note pads, pens, other writing tools.





Arriving Late to School & Leaving Early From School

All students arriving after 8:00 AM, whether they are tardy or coming from an appointment are required to be signed into school by an adult. An adult will need to escort a student who is arriving to school after 8:00 AM into the school office and sign the student in for the day. Students should not be dropped off without an adult escort.

If your child needs to leave school during school hours, please send a written, dated, and signed note to your child's teacher the morning of the day your child will need to leave school. Please include the name of the individual(s) who will be responsible for picking up your child. It is also helpful if you let the person picking up your child know which teacher your child has, this is also a safety precaution for our staff.

When signing a child out of school early, you will need to go directly to the Indian Creek Office where you will sign your son or daughter out on the computer, at that time we will call your student to the office. Please allow time for your child to be called from class, as we do not call students for pick up until someone is here to get them. When returning to school, we ask all parents and students to please report to the Indian Creek Office to sign your child back in to school. Students should not go to their classrooms before their parents sign them into school and parents are asked to let their students return to their classrooms on their own. Thank you so much for your cooperation.

PINK NOTES



Pink notes are an Indian Creek communication tool. The pink note is sent at the end of the day to students who have a change in their typical way home ~ please remember the notes are not meant to be a daily communication tool for your child. We ask that parents/gaurdians send a dated and signed note with your child the morning of the planned change indicating how he or she will be going home. If you need to call to make an unplanned change you (the parent or guardian) must call before 2:00 pm. As safety measures to ensure safety for our students we will expect you know who your child's teacher is and what their bus number is, if your child rides the bus. Do not send an e-mail indicating changes for your children as we cannot guarantee the person receiving the e-mail will be able to see the message in time, or they may be out of the office for the day, in meetings or the computer/server may be down. We appreciate your cooperation with keeping the end of day routines as safe as possible for your student.



Indian Creek Newsletters

The Indian Creek Newsletter is published at the beginning of the month. The full version of the monthly newsletter will be posted to the Indian Creek website. A printed version can be sent home with your student if you do not have computer access and would like a copy. Please let Mrs. Harder know if you would like to be added to the list.



Weekly E-Mails

Mrs. Harder (Pam), our school secretary, will send out a weekly e-mail with important information for the week, please look for these e-mails on Monday afternoons. She also sends reminders and notifications throughout the school year as needed. You will want to be sure your e-mail is up to date in PowerSchool in the contact 1, contact 2 and guardian e-mail slots, this is where the e-mail addresses are pulled from. If you have <u>not</u> been receiving the e-mail

messages from Mrs. Harder, please email her at pharder@linnmar.k12.ia.us and she will be sure to add you to the list. **Just a reminder; sometimes our e-mail messages end up in your junk folder due to the large amount of recipients we send messages to. A simple way to prevent the e-mail from going to your junk folder is to add pharder@linnmar.k12.ia.us to your address book.

Txtwire


Hy-Vee Receipts

3Rd Grade Testing

Parents/Guardians of 3rd Grade Students:


During the first full week of the school year, all Linn-Mar 3rd grade students will take an assessment called the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) Screening Form. This test is the first step in identifying students who show a need for additional academic enrichment through the Learning Enrichment Opportunities (LEO) program which begins in 3rd grade.

In past years, the CogAT has been given near the end of the year to a small group of 2nd graders who showed a need for academic enrichment as evidenced by the NWEA tests. However, because of recent changes to the district standardized testing requirements, we are now able to provide the CogAT Screening Form to all 3rd graders in the district.

The CogAT is a standardized test, but quite different from Fastbridge Assessments and Iowa Statewide Assessments of Student Progress. The CogAT measures students' learned reasoning and problem-solving abilities in the three areas most linked to success in school--Verbal, Quantitative, and Non-Verbal Reasoning. The CogAT measures the cognitive processes that a child has developed to learn new things and solve problems. Experiences both in and out of school affect this skill development.

The CogAT Screening Form is a shortened form of the CogAT and consists of three separate tests: Verbal Analogies, Number Analogies, and Figure Matrices. The test will be administered in one 45-minute session during the week of August 26. Your child's classroom teacher will notify you with the specific date and time of the test. Based on the results of the CogAT Screening Form, students who show a need for completing the full CogAT will be notified by mail in late September. Results of the full CogAT will be used to identify students who qualify for 3rd grade LEO. Families of students who qualify for 3rd grade LEO will be notified in mid-October.

Dear Parents and Students,

We need your help! The Linn-Mar Stadium has 5,000 seats on the home side! That means there is enough seating to handle our crowds so we expect our students to stay in the stands and watch the games.

Some of our students prefer to congregate under the stands or run around at top of bleachers, which encourages horseplay and other types of inappropriate behavior that is unsafe. Students should stay in the stands unless they are going to the concession stand or restroom. We need parents to discourage students from loitering beneath the bleachers. Nobody will be allowed on the grassy hillside behind the South end zone, either.

Supervisors will monitor these areas and direct students to return to the stands if they are just milling about. Students who are uncooperative will be asked to leave. If asked to leave, students will be banned from future game(s). Parents will be notified if this happens.

<u>Please avoid bringing backpacks to the stadium</u>. They will not be allowed inside the bleachers and if so will be stored in an area by the front gates.

<u>Seating:</u> There will be separate designated areas for Linn-Mar High School students, the band and Middle School students. These sections are all located in the lower level. <u>All elementary students should be sitting with or in the vicinity of their parents.</u> Please do not just let your children run around unattended or drop them off at stadium without an adult. They will be asked to leave if this is the case.

Our first home football game is Friday, August 30th vs Dubuque Senior. Our sophomore game begins at 5:00 p.m. followed by the varsity game at approximately 7:30 pm. We anticipate a big crowd! We hope you can join us for this event!

Most importantly, we encourage all our adults & students to be positive fans watching the game and cheering on our teams from the stands.
